1 AN ACT concerning the board of governors of Rutgers, The State
2 University and amending N.J.S.18A:65-14 and N.J.S.18A:65-22.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. N.J.S.18A:65-14 is amended to read as follows:

8 18A:65-14. The membership of the board of governors shall be
9 classified as follows and consist of:

10 a. the president of the corporation, serving as an ex officio
11 non-voting member; and

12 b. **[15]** 19 voting members,

13 i. **[seven]** nine of whom shall be appointed by the Governor of
14 the State, with the advice and consent of the Senate, with one of
15 these members being a resident of Camden County, and one of
16 whom shall be appointed by the Governor upon the
17 recommendation of the President of the Senate and the Speaker of
18 the General Assembly and who shall be a resident of Essex County,
19 **[and]**

20 ii. seven of whom shall be appointed by the board of trustees,
21 from among their members, one of whom shall be a resident of
22 Essex County and one of whom shall be a resident of Middlesex
23 County, elected and serving under the provisions of subsection I.c.
24 or I.d. of 18A:65-15 , and

25 iii. one of whom shall be appointed by the President of the
26 Senate and one of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker of the
27 General Assembly.

28 The first additional appointments made by the Governor pursuant
29 to P.L.2012, c.45 (C.18A:64M-1 et al.) and P.L. , c. (pending
30 before the Legislature as this bill), shall not require the advice and
31 consent of the Senate, but thereafter such advice and consent shall
32 be required.

33 All members shall serve for terms of six years, except that the
34 terms of those initially appointed by the Governor which began on
35 September 1, 1956, shall expire respectively (as designated by him)
36 one, two, three, four, five and six years after June 30, 1956, and
37 terms of those initially appointed by the board of trustees which
38 began on September 1, 1956, shall expire respectively (as
39 designated by the board) two, three, four, five and six years after
40 June 30, 1956; all of whose respective successors shall be appointed
41 to serve six-year terms. Governors may succeed themselves for not
42 more than one additional term after having served one full six-year
43 term (including an initial term beginning on September 1, 1956, and
44 expiring on June 30, 1962).
