**SYNOPSIS**

Permits issuance of motorcycle endorsement to certain out-of-State military personnel.

1 AN ACT concerning driver licensing and supplementing Title 39 of  
2 the Revised Statutes.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law, rule, or  
8 regulation to the contrary, the chief administrator shall, upon  
9 written request, issue by mail a motorcycle endorsement to a person  
10 who holds a valid New Jersey driver's license and is a member, the  
11 spouse of a member, or a dependent of a member of the armed  
12 services of the United States serving outside the State if the person  
13 provides documentation suitable to the chief administrator of:

14 a. successful completion of a basic motorcycle rider course  
15 approved by the armed services of the United States or another  
16 state, provided that the course is substantially similar to the course  
17 established pursuant to the provisions of section 1 of P.L.1991,  
18 c.452 (C.27:5F-36); and

19 b. assignment outside of the State.

21 2. This act shall take effect on the first day of the third month  
22 following enactment.

25 STATEMENT

27 This bill would allow out-of-State members of the military,  
28 spouses of the members, and their dependents, to receive a  
29 motorcycle endorsement for their valid New Jersey driver's license  
30 while serving in another state without returning to New Jersey to  
31 retake a written or road test, or to complete another motorcycle  
32 safety course.

33 The chief administrator would be required to issue the  
34 endorsement by mail if the person provides documentation of the  
35 completion of a basic motorcycle rider course similar to the one  
36 required by State law and approved by the armed services of the  
37 United State or another state. The person also would be required to  
38 provide documentation of their assignment outside of the State.
