Have a Hand in Lawmaking.

Your lawmakers need to hear from you in order to craft laws which protect and serve your needs. Here's what you can do to help.

Look, listen and learn.

The best way to get involved is to know what's going on. Watch the news. Read the papers. Talk with other people to hear their ideas.

You can get copies of bills and other useful information on the Internet or from people at the State House.

Write or call.

Your governor and lawmakers want to hear from you.

Use the Internet (www.njleg.state.nj.us) or call 800-792-8630 to get contact information. Then write a letter, call or e-mail.

Join forces.

Work with other people or groups who share your ideas. Start a petition with signatures of all the people who support your issues. Attend rallies and public demonstrations.

Vote.

Voting is a very special right, because each election offers a chance to express your feelings. If you're too young to vote now, ask to go with your parents or guardian. Everyone over 18 needs

to register with the local Board of Elections in order to vote.
