#### **SYNOPSIS**

Restricts practice of midwifery to State-licensed registered professional nurse.

### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As introduced.



1 **AN ACT** concerning the practice of midwifery and amending 2 R.S.45:10-1 through R.S.45:10-3.

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4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. R.S.45:10-1 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 45:10-1. A person shall be regarded as practicing midwifery within
- 9 the meaning of this chapter who: is a registered professional nurse
- 10 <u>licensed in the State; is certified as a nurse midwife by a national</u>
- certifying body; and attends a woman in childbirth as a certified nurse
- 12 midwife, or advertises as such, by signs, printed cards or otherwise,
- but nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prohibit gratuitous
- service in case of emergency, nor the service of any legally qualified
- 15 physician or surgeon of this [state] State.
- 16 (cf: R.S.45:10-1)

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- 2. R.S.45:10-2 is amended to read as follows:
- 19 45:10-2. A person desiring to begin the practice of midwifery in
- 20 this [state] State shall first be a registered professional nurse licensed
- 21 <u>in the State and shall</u> obtain from the [state board of medical
- 22 examiners State Board of Medical Examiners, hereinafter in this
- chapter designated as the "board", a license to do so, as hereinafter
- 24 provided. The board shall execute the provisions of this chapter, and
- 25 shall hold examinations in midwifery [in the state house at Trenton
- annually on the third Tuesday in June and October from ten A.M. to
- 27 five P.M., or] at such [other] place and times as it may deem
- 28 expedient.

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- 3. R.S.45:10-3 is amended to read as follows:
- 32 45:10-3. Candidates for examination shall present to the board, at
- 33 least ten days before the examination, a written application on a form
- 34 provided by the board, setting forth under affidavit the name, age,
- and nativity, residence, moral character [and time spent in obtaining a
- 36 common school education, or its equivalent; and that the candidate
- has received a certificate or diploma from a legally incorporated school of midwifery, or maternity hospital, in good standing in the opinion of
- of midwifery, or maternity hospital, in good standing in the opinion of the board at the time of issuing the certificate or diploma, granted after
- 40 at least eighteen hundred hours' instruction within a period of not less
- than nine months, or a certificate or diploma from a foreign institution
- 42 of midwifery of equal requirements as determined by the board,

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11	4. This act shall take effect immediately.
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14	STATEMENT
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16	This bill amends current law to restrict the practice of midwifery in
17	the State to individuals who are licensed by the State as a registered
18	professional nurse and who are certified as a nurse midwife by a
19	national certifying body.
20	Under current law, an individual may be licensed to practice
21	midwifery upon: earning a certificate or diploma from a school of
22	midwifery in good standing in the opinion of the State Board of
23	Medical Examiners, granted after at least 1,800 hours of instruction;
24	and passing a Statewide examination.
25	Although State law does not limit the practice of midwifery to
26	registered professional nurses, current regulation provides solely for
27	the certification of nurse midwives.
