Permits historic motor vehicles to be used for pleasure driving one day per week.

1 AN ACT concerning historic motor vehicles and amending
2 P.L.1964, c.195.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
5 *of New Jersey:*

7 1. Section 1 of P.L.1964, c.195 (C.39:3-27.3) is amended to read
8 as follows:

9 As used in this act:

10 "Historic motor vehicle" shall mean any motor vehicle which is
11 at least 25 years old **【and which】** is owned as a collector's item,
12 and used **【solely】** for occasional travel and exhibition and
13 educational purposes by the owner;

14 **【"Director" shall mean the Director of Motor Vehicles.】**

15 "Occasional travel" shall mean driving a historic motor vehicle
16 not more than one day per week for other than exhibition and
17 educational purposes.

20 2. This act shall take effect on the first day of the sixth month
21 after enactment.

24 STATEMENT

25

26 Under current law, owners of properly registered historic motor
27 vehicles are permitted to operate them solely for exhibition and
28 educational purposes. This bill permits the use of these vehicles
29 also for occasional travel or pleasure driving, which is defined as
30 not more than one day per week.

31 In order to be designated as an historic motor vehicle, a vehicle
32 must be at least 25 years old and owned as a collector's item.

33 This bill also removes the definition of Director of Motor
34 Vehicles from the statute as the Motor Vehicle Commission is now
35 led by a chief administrator.

EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets **【thus】** in the above bill is
not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter underlined thus is new matter.
