- 1. Section 6 of P.L.1947, c.94 (C.33:1-12.18) is amended to read as follows:
- 6. [Nothing] In any case in which a timely renewal was not 10 filed, nothing in this act shall be deemed to prevent the issuance of a new license to a person who files an application therefor within 12 [60 days] five years following the expiration of the license renewal period, but who pays the municipal and State renewal fees for each 14 year for which a timely renewal application was not filed, if the director shall determine in writing that the applicant's failure to apply for a renewal of his license was due to circumstances beyond 17 his control or other extraordinary circumstances.

Any request for relief under this section shall be filed not later than five years following the expiration of the license which was not renewed in a timely manner and shall be accompanied by a nonreturnable filing fee of \$100.00 payable to the director for each license term.

A new license issued pursuant to this section shall be assigned the same license number as the license which was not renewed in a timely manner.

Under current law, an issuing authority may issue a new retail alcoholic beverage license to a licensee who did not file a timely license renewal if (1) the licensee files an application within 60 days of the license expiration date, and (2) the Director of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control determines that the applicant's failure to apply for renewal of the license was due to circumstances beyond his or her control.

This bill permits an issuing authority to issue a new plenary retail consumption license to a licensee who did not file timely renewal but files an application within five years after the expiration of the license renewal period. The issuing authority would be permitted to issue the new license only if the director determines that the applicant's failure to apply for a renewal of his

- 1 license was due to circumstances beyond his control or other extraordinary circumstances. The licensee would be required to pay 2 3 the municipal and State renewal fees for each year for which a 4 timely renewal application was not filed. 5 The licensee must file the request no later than five years after 6 the expiration of the license which was not renewed in a timely 7 manner. A filing fee of \$100 is payable to the director for each 8 license term.
- A new license issued pursuant to this bill would be assigned the same license number as the license which was not renewed in a timely manner.
