SYNOPSIS

Reduces tasks that may be performed by pharmacy technicians.

## CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As introduced.



1 AN ACT concerning pharmacy technicians and amending P.L.2003, 2 c.280. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 41 of P.L.2003, c.280 (C.45:14-80) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 41. a. Pharmacy technicians may assist a licensed pharmacist in 10 performing the following tasks: 11 (1) Retrieval of prescription files, patient files and profiles and 12 other records, as determined by the board, pertaining to the practice 13 of pharmacy; and 14 (2) Data entry **[**; 15 (3) Label preparation; and 16 (4) Counting, weighing, measuring, pouring and compounding 17 of prescription medication or stock legend drugs and controlled substances, including the filling of an automated medication 18 19 system]. 20 b. Pharmacy technicians may accept authorization from a 21 patient for a prescription refill, or from a physician or the 22 physician's agent for a prescription renewal, provided that the 23 prescription remains unchanged. As used in this section, 24 "prescription refill" means the dispensing of medications pursuant 25 to a prescriber's authorization provided on the original prescription and "prescription renewal" means the dispensing of medications 26 27 pursuant to a practitioner's authorization to fill an existing prescription that has no refills remaining. 28 29 c. Pharmacy technicians shall not: 30 (1) Receive new verbal prescriptions; 31 (2) Interpret a prescription or medication order for therapeutic 32 acceptability and appropriateness; 33 (3) Verify dosage and directions; 34 (4) Engage in prospective drug review; 35 (5) Provide patient counseling; 36 (6) Monitor prescription usage; 37 (7) Override computer alerts without first notifying the 38 pharmacist; 39 (8) Transfer prescriptions from one pharmacy to another 40 pharmacy; or 41 (9) Violate patient confidentiality. 42 d. Except as provided in subsection e. of this section, a 43 pharmacist shall not supervise more than two pharmacy technicians.

e. A pharmacy that wishes to employ a licensed pharmacist to
pharmacy technician ratio greater than established in accordance
with subsection d. of this section, shall:

4 (1) Establish written job descriptions, task protocols and
5 policies and procedures that pertain to the duties performed by the
6 pharmacy technician;

7 (2) Ensure and document that each pharmacy technician pass the 8 National Pharmacy Technician Certification Examination or a board 9 approved certification program and fulfill the requirements to 10 maintain this status, or complete a program which includes a testing 11 component and which has been approved by the board as satisfying 12 the criteria as set forth in subsection f. of this section;

(3) Ensure that each pharmacy technician is knowledgeable in
the established job descriptions, task protocols and policies and
procedures in the pharmacy setting in which the technician is to
perform his duties;

17 (4) Ensure that the duties assigned to any pharmacy technician
18 do not exceed the established job descriptions, task protocols and
19 policies and procedures;

20 (5) Ensure that each pharmacy technician receives in-service
21 training before the pharmacy technician assumes his responsibilities
22 and maintain documentation thereof;

23 (6) Require and maintain on site a signed patient confidentiality24 statement from each technician;

25 (7) Provide immediate personal supervision; and

(8) Provide the board, upon request, with a copy of the
established job descriptions, task protocols and policies and
procedures for all pharmacy technician duties.

f. If the pharmacist to pharmacy technician ratio is greater than
the ratio established in accordance with the provisions of subsection
d. of this section, the pharmacy shall maintain a policy and
procedure manual with regard to pharmacy technicians, which shall
include the following:

35 (2) Confidentiality safeguards of patient information;

36 (3) Minimum qualifications;

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37 (4) Documentation of in-service education or ongoing training
38 and demonstration of competency, specific to practice site and job

(5) General duties and responsibilities of pharmacy technicians;

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1 (10) Procedures dealing with documentation and records required 2 for controlled dangerous substance and prescription legend drugs; 3 (11) Procedures dealing with medication errors; (12) Pharmacy technician functions related to automated 4 5 systems; (13) Functions that may not be performed by pharmacy 6 7 technicians; and (14) A form signed by the pharmacy technician which verifies 8 9 that the manual has been reviewed by the technician. 10 g. The pharmacist in charge shall review the policy and 11 procedure manual at least every two years and, if necessary, amend 12 the manual as needed. Documentation of the review shall be made 13 available to the board upon request. Pharmacy technicians shall wear an identification tag, which 14 h. 15 shall include at least their first name, the first initial of their last 16 name and title. 17 i. On pharmacy permit renewal applications, the pharmacy shall list the name and address of all pharmacy technicians which it 18 19 currently employs. 20 When pharmacy technicians are engaged in any activities j. permitted in accordance with the provisions of this section, the 21 22 licensed pharmacists on site shall be responsible for these activities. 23 (cf: P.L.2003, c.280, s.41) 24 25 2. This act shall take effect on the 30th day following 26 enactment. 27 28 29 **STATEMENT** 30 31 Under the current provisions of section 41 of P.L.2003, c.280 32 (C.45:14-80), a pharmacy technician may assist a licensed 33 pharmacist to perform various tasks, including: label preparation; 34 and counting, weighing, measuring, pouring and compounding of prescription medication or stock legend drugs and controlled 35 36 substances. The bill amends this section of law by removing 37 authorization for a pharmacy technician to engage in the aforementioned tasks. 38
