Establishes exclusive State regulatory authority over apiary activities and allows for delegation of monitoring and enforcement authority to municipalities.

THE REAL PROPERTY.

AN ACT concerning the regulation of apiary activities, and
 supplementing Titles 4 and 40 of the Revised Statutes.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
of New Jersey:

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7 1. a. Except as otherwise provided in subsection b. of this8 section, no municipality may:

9 (1) adopt an ordinance, resolution, rule, or regulation 10 concerning the breeding or keeping of honey bees or any activities 11 related thereto, including, but not limited to, the use of honey bees 12 for pollination, the reproduction and sale of honey bees, or the 13 production of honey or other apiary products from such bees; or

(2) establish any restriction or requirement that would result in
the prohibition of the breeding or keeping of honey bees, the use of
honey bees for pollination, or any activities related thereto, in the
municipality.

18 b. The State shall regulate apiary activities in the State 19 pursuant to R.S.4:6-1 through R.S.4:6-18, sections 8 and 9 of P.L.1977, c.159 (C.4:6-19 and C.4:6-20), P.L.2007, c.271 (C.4:6-21 20 21 et seq.), section 2 of P.L. , c. (C. ) (pending before the 22 Legislature as this bill), and any applicable laws. However, it may 23 delegate to a municipality the regulatory authority to monitor and 24 enforce the apiary standards established pursuant to subsection b. of 25 section 2 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as 26 this bill), if the municipality adopts by reference those standards by 27 ordinance. Upon adoption of such an ordinance, the municipality 28 may assume responsibility to monitor apiary activities in the 29 municipality and enforce compliance with the standards adopted 30 pursuant to subsection b. of section 2 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending 31 before the Legislature as this bill).

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The Department of Agriculture shall regulate the 33 2. a 34 breeding and keeping of honey bees and any activities related 35 thereto, including, but not limited to, the use of honey bees for 36 pollination, the reproduction and sale of honey bees, and the 37 production of honey and other apiary products from such bees, and 38 may delegate its monitoring and enforcement authority to a 39 municipality pursuant to subsection b. of section 1 of P.L. 40 c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

b. Pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968,
c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), the Department of Agriculture shall
adopt any rules and regulations necessary for the implementation of
P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill),
including but not limited to:

46 (1) apiary standards for the breeding and keeping of honey bees,47 the use of honey bees for pollination, the reproduction and sale of

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honey bees, and the production of honey and other apiary products 1 2 from such bees; and 3 (2) standards of administrative procedure for a municipality to 4 monitor and enforce the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to this subsection. The standards shall include provisions for the 5 preparation and submittal to the department by the municipality of 6 periodic reports on the results of monitoring and enforcement 7 activities undertaken by the municipality. 8 9

10 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
