5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
6 of New Jersey:

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²<u>1. As used in this act:</u>

"Potential indicators of dyslexia or other reading disabilities" 9 10 means indicators that include, but shall not be limited to, difficulty 11 in acquiring language skills; inability to comprehend oral or written 12 language; difficulty in rhyming words; difficulty in naming letters, 13 recognizing letters, matching letters to sounds, and blending sounds 14 when speaking and reading words; difficulty recognizing and 15 remembering sight words; consistent transposition of number 16 sequences, letter reversals, inversions, and substitutions; and 17 trouble in replication of content.²

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²[1] 2.² a. The Commissioner of Education shall distribute to 19 each board of education information on screening instruments 20 available to identify students who ²[exhibit] possess one or more² 21 potential indicators of dyslexia 2 [and] <u>or</u>² other reading disabilities 22 pursuant to section ${}^{2}[2] \underline{3}^{2}$ of this act. The commissioner shall 23 provide information on the screening instruments appropriate for 24 kindergarten 2 [1 <u>and first</u>] <u>through second</u> 2 <u>grade</u> 1 students and on 25 screening instruments that may be suitably used for older students. 26 27 A board of education shall select and implement age-appropriate screening instruments for the early diagnosis of dyslexia and other 28 29 reading disabilities.

b. The commissioner shall develop and distribute to each board
of education guidance on appropriate intervention strategies for
students diagnosed with dyslexia or other reading disabilities.

In the event that a student is determined through the 23 screening conducted pursuant to section ${}^{2}[2] \underline{3}^{2}$ of this act to 24 ²[exhibit] possess one or more² potential indicators of dyslexia or 25 other reading ² [disability] <u>disabilities</u>², the board of education shall 26 27 ensure that the student receives a comprehensive assessment for the 28 learning disorder. In the event that a diagnosis ²of dyslexia or other reading disability² is confirmed 2 by the comprehensive assessment², 29 the board of education shall provide appropriate ²evidence-based² 30 31 intervention strategies to the student, including intense instruction 32 on phonemic awareness, phonics and fluency, vocabulary, and 33 reading comprehension.

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²[4] <u>5.</u>² This act shall take effect immediately and shall first 35 apply to the ²[2013-2014] <u>2014-2015</u>² school year ²; provided, 36 however, that the Commissioner of Education shall take any 37 anticipatory actions that the commissioner determines to be 38 39 necessary and appropriate to effectuate the purposes of this act prior to the 2014-2015 school year². 40
