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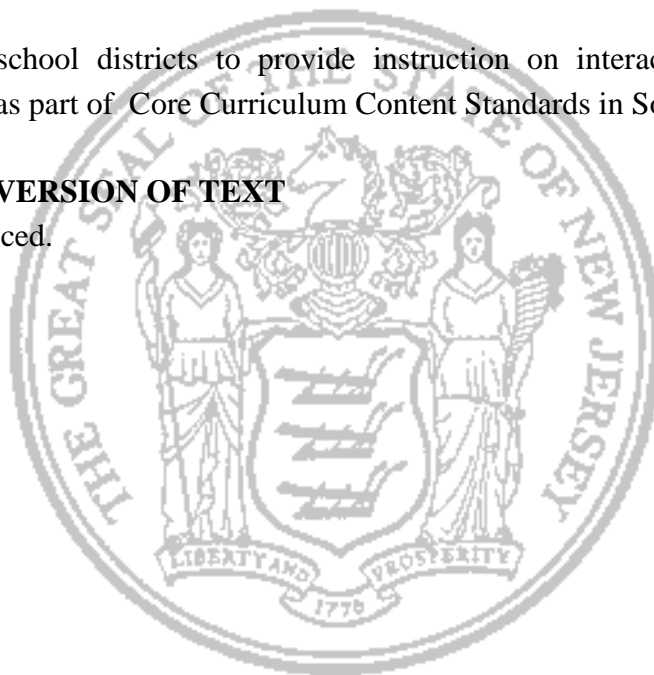

SYNOPSIS

Requires school districts to provide instruction on interacting with law enforcement as part of Core Curriculum Content Standards in Social Studies.

1 AN ACT concerning the Core Curriculum Content Standards and
2 supplementing chapter 35 of Title 18A of the New Jersey
3 Statutes.

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5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
6 of New Jersey:

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8 1. Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, each school
9 district shall incorporate instruction on interacting with a law
10 enforcement official in a manner marked by mutual cooperation and
11 respect as part of the district's implementation of the Core
12 Curriculum Content Standards in Social Studies. The instruction
13 shall be included in an appropriate place in the curriculum of
14 elementary school, middle school, and high school students. The
15 instruction shall provide students with information on:

16 a. the role and responsibilities of a law enforcement official in
17 providing for public safety; and

18 b. an individual's responsibilities to comply with a directive
19 from a law enforcement official.

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21 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

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26 This bill requires school districts to provide instruction on
27 interacting with law enforcement in a manner marked by mutual
28 cooperation and respect as part of the implementation of the Core
29 Curriculum Content Standards in Social Studies, beginning with the
30 2015-2016 school year. The instruction must provide students with
31 information on: the role and responsibilities of a law enforcement
32 official in providing for public safety; and an individual's
33 responsibilities to comply with a directive from a law enforcement
34 official.
