AN ACT concerning the designation of certain State purchase and 1 2 construction contracts as set-asides for businesses owned and 3 operated by disabled veterans and supplementing Title 52 of the 4 **Revised Statutes.** 5 6 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 7 of New Jersey: 8 9 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Set-Aside 10 Act for Disabled Veterans' Businesses." 11 12 2. As used in this act: ¹["Commission" means the New Jersey Commerce and 13 14 Economic Growth Commission.]¹ 15 "Contracting agency" means the State or any board, commission, committee, authority or agency of the State. 16 ¹"Department" means the Department of the Treasury.¹ 17 "Disabled veteran" means a resident of this State who is certified 18 by the federal Department of Veterans' Affairs as having any degree 19 of service-connected disability. 20 21 "Disabled veterans' business" means a business which has its 22 principal place of business in the State, is independently owned and operated and at least 51% of which is owned and controlled by 23 persons who are disabled veterans ²or a business which has its 24 principal place of business in this State and has been officially 25 verified by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs as a 26 27 service disabled veteran-owned business for the purposes of department contracts pursuant to federal law². 28 "Disabled veterans' business set-aside contract" means a contract 29 for goods, equipment, construction or services which is designated 30 31 as a contract with respect to which bids are invited and accepted only from disabled veterans' businesses, or a portion of a contract 32 33 when that portion has been so designated. ¹["Office" means the Office of Small Business Assistance in the 34 New Jersey Commerce and Economic Growth Commission.]¹ 35 36 3. The ¹[Office of Small Business Assistance in the New 37

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Jersey Commerce and Economic Growth Commission] Department
 of the Treasury¹ shall administer a disabled veterans' business set aside program which shall be in addition to any other set-aside
 program established by law. ¹The department shall require proof of
 disabled veteran status for all appropriate individuals.¹

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7 4. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any State bidding or 8 public contracts laws to the contrary, but subject to any supervening 9 federal statutes or rules, contracting agencies, in consultation with the ¹[commission] department¹, may designate a contract, or a 10 portion thereof, for goods, equipment, construction or services to be 11 12 awarded by a contracting agency as a disabled veterans' business 13 set-aside contract pursuant to the goals and procedures established in this act, whenever there is a reasonable expectation that bids may 14 15 be obtained from at least three qualified disabled veterans' 16 businesses capable of furnishing the desired goods, equipment, 17 construction or services at a fair and reasonable price. The 18 designation shall be made prior to the advertisement for bids.

b. When application of the goals and procedures established under this act would jeopardize the State's participation in a program from which the State receives federal funds or other benefits, the contracting agency may, in consultation with the **1**[commission] department¹, withdraw the affected contracts from consideration or calculation.

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26 5. a. There are established the goals that contracting agencies award at least 3% of their contracts to disabled veterans' businesses. 27 These goals may, when appropriate, be attained by the direct 28 29 designation of prime contracts for these business or, in the case of a 30 prime contract not directly so designated, by requiring that a portion 31 of such a prime contract be subcontracted to a disabled veterans' 32 business. Each contracting agency shall make a good faith effort to 33 attain the goals established in this subsection.

b. For purposes of attaining this goal, contracting agencies
shall, when necessary, specifically set aside contracts or portions of
contracts for which only these businesses may bid.

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6. If the **'[**commission**]** <u>department</u>¹ and the contracting agency disagree as to whether a set-aside is appropriate for a contract or a portion of a contract, the dispute shall, within seven days, be submitted to the State Treasurer, or his designee, for final determination.

set-aside contract shall indicate the invitation to bid as a set-aside.
The advertisement shall be in such newspaper or newspapers as will
best give notice thereof to appropriate bidders and shall be

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sufficiently in advance of the purchase or contract to promote 1 2 competitive bidding among the businesses for which the contract is 3 The newspaper or newspapers in which the being set aside. 4 advertisement shall appear shall be selected by the contracting agency in consultation with the ¹[office] department¹. 5 The advertisement shall designate the time and place at which sealed 6 7 proposals shall be received and publicly opened and read, the 8 amount of the cash or certified check, if any, which shall 9 accompany each bid and such other items as the contracting agency may deem proper. The advertisement shall be made by that 10 11 contracting agency pursuant to the procedure set forth in the law 12 governing State contracts, when this act is inconsistent with that 13 law. 14

8. a. The '[commission] department¹ shall establish
reasonable regulations appropriate for controlling the designation of
prospective disabled veterans' business bidders and shall maintain
lists of designated businesses.

b. The '[commission] department' shall establish a procedure
whereby businesses may request inclusion on appropriate lists for
disabled veterans' businesses.

c. The '[commission] department' shall establish a procedure
for annually reviewing the lists and determining whether the
businesses on the lists shall continue to be designated as disabled
veterans' businesses.

d. The '[commission] department' shall establish a procedure
whereby the designation of a business as a disabled veterans'
business may be challenged by a third party.

e. Any procedures established pursuant to subsections b., c.,
and d. of this section shall include notice to the business whose
designation is at issue and an opportunity for a hearing at the
¹[commission] department¹. The hearing shall not be considered a
contested case under the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968,
c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.).

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36 9. When a contract or portion thereof has been designated as a 37 disabled veterans' business set-aside, invitations for bids shall be 38 confined to businesses designated by the ¹[commission] 39 department¹ as appropriate for the set-aside and bids from other 40 bidders shall be rejected. The purchase, contract or expenditure of 41 funds shall be awarded among the businesses, considering 42 conformity with specifications and terms, in accordance with the 43 statutes and rules governing purchases by the contracting agency. 44 The award shall be made with reasonable promptness by the contracting agency with written notice to the ¹[commission] 45 department¹. 46

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10. If the contracting agency determines that the acceptance of 1 2 the lowest responsible bid on a disabled veteran business set-aside 3 contract will result either in the payment of an unreasonable price 4 or in a contract otherwise unacceptable pursuant to the statutes and 5 rules governing purchases by that agency, the contracting agency shall reject all bids and withdraw the designation of the set-aside 6 7 contract. Bidders shall be notified of the set-aside cancellation, the 8 reasons for the rejection and the State's intent to resolicit bids on an 9 unrestricted basis. The canceled solicitation shall not be counted as 10 a set-aside for the purpose of attaining established set-aside goals. 11 Except in cases of emergency, prior to the final award of the 12 contract, the contracting agency shall provide an opportunity for a 13 hearing on the reasons for the rejection of the set-aside designation. 14 This hearing shall not be considered a contested case under the 15 "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et 16 seq.). 17 18 11. Each contracting agency shall submit an annual report to the ¹[commission] department¹ according to a schedule announced by 19 the ¹[commission] <u>department</u>¹. This report shall include the 20 21 following information: a. the total dollar value and number of contracts awarded to 22 23 disabled veterans' businesses, including a separate accounting of any set-aside contracts, and the percentage of the total State 24 25 procurements by the contracting agency that the figure of total 26 dollar value and the number of set-asides reflect; 27 b. the types and sizes of businesses receiving set-aside awards 28 and the nature of the purchases and contracts; and 29 the efforts made to publicize and promote the program. с. 30 The ¹[commission] <u>department</u>¹ shall receive and analyze the reports submitted by the contracting agencies and, utilizing these 31 32 data, submit an annual report to the Governor, and the Legislature pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), showing 33 34 the progress being made toward the objectives and goals of this act 35 during the preceding fiscal year. 36 37 12. Each contracting agency shall annually develop, in consultation with the ¹[commission] <u>department</u>¹, a plan for 38 achieving its disabled veterans' business goals. 39 40 13. The ¹[commission and office] <u>department</u>¹ shall consult 41 42 regularly with representatives of the contracting industry for the 43 purpose of implementing the provisions of this act. These consultations shall take place no less than once every six months. 44 45 46 14. When the ¹[commission] <u>department</u>¹ determines that a

47 business has been classified as a disabled veterans' business on the

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basis of false information knowingly supplied by the business and 1 2 has been awarded a contract to which it would not otherwise have been entitled under this act, the ¹[commission] <u>department</u>¹ shall: 3 assess the business any difference between the contract 4 a. 5 amount and what the State's cost would have been if the contract had not been awarded in accordance with the provisions of this act; 6 7 b. in addition to the amount due under subsection a., assess the 8 business a penalty in an amount of not more than 10% of the 9 amount of the contract involved; c. order the business ineligible to transact any business with 10 11 the State for a period of not less than three months and not more 12 than 24 months; and d. prior to any final determination, assessment or order under 13 14 this section, afford the business an opportunity for a contested case 15 hearing pursuant to P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.). All payments to the State pursuant to subsection a. of this section 16 17 shall be deposited in the fund out of which the contract involved was awarded. All payments to the State pursuant to subsection b. of 18 19 this section shall be deposited in the General Fund. 20 15.
