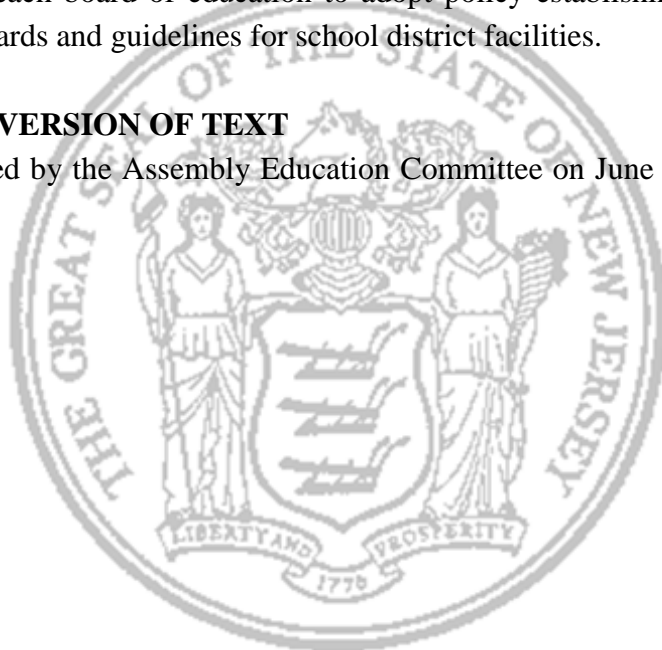

SYNOPSIS

Requires each board of education to adopt policy establishing temperature control standards and guidelines for school district facilities.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Assembly Education Committee on June 20, 2016, with amendments.

1 AN ACT concerning temperature control of public school buildings
2 and supplementing chapter 33 of Title 18A of the New Jersey
3 Statutes.

5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
6 of New Jersey:

8 1. Each board of education shall adopt a policy establishing
9 temperature control standards and guidelines for school district
10 facilities. The policy shall ensure, to the greatest extent feasible,
11 that school buildings provide students with a temperature-controlled
12 environment that is conducive to learning. The policy shall:

13 a. require, in each school building in the district, that ¹**[the**
14 principal designate¹] a staff member ¹**be designated¹** to monitor
15 compliance with the standards and initiate permitted corrective
16 measures ¹**[when necessary¹]**;

17 b. establish a protocol to follow in instances where classroom
18 temperatures are identified as being not conducive to learning;
19 ¹**[and¹]**

20 c. identify what temperature control measures are permitted ¹**[,**
21 and which shall be¹] in accordance with local building and fire
22 codes¹;

23 d. be informed by the temperature standards outlined in
24 N.J.A.C.12:100-13.3(a)4 of the Indoor Air Quality Standard
25 established by the Department of Labor and Workforce
26 Development; and

27 e. require corrective measures be addressed, where feasible, by
28 action outlined in N.J.A.C.12:100-13.3(a)1 of the Indoor Air
29 Quality Standard established by the Department of Labor and
30 Workforce Development¹.

32 ¹2. The Department of Education and the Department of Health
33 shall jointly develop guidance to assist school districts in
34 establishing and implementing a policy concerning temperature
35 control.¹

37 ¹**[2.] 3.¹** This act shall take effect on July 1 of the school year
38 following enactment.
