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40	This bill requires each board of education to adopt a policy
41	establishing temperature control standards and guidelines for school
42	district facilities. The policy must ensure, to the greatest extent

The bill directs the Department of Education and the Department of Health to jointly develop guidance to assist school districts in establishing and implementing a policy concerning temperature control.
