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#### **SYNOPSIS**

Requires institution of higher education to award appropriate credit for student's military service.

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As reported by the Senate Higher Education Committee on November 18, 2019, with amendments.

1	AN ACT concerning veterans <sup>2</sup> and students in the military <sup>2</sup> at
2	<sup>2</sup> [public] <sup>2</sup> institutions of higher education and supplementing
3	chapter <sup>2</sup> [62] <u>3B</u> <sup>2</sup> of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- <sup>1</sup>[1. a. As used in this section, "veteran" means an individual who served on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States, a Reserve component thereof, or the National Guard, and who was honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances from active service.
- b. A public institution of higher education shall adopt a policy to award academic credit to veterans. The policy shall grant a veteran who is accepted to pursue a course of study at the institution a minimum of six credits upon the veteran's enrollment.

1. a. Each public and independent institution of higher education, after taking into account and giving due consideration to the credit recommendation of the American Council on Education, shall accept and apply towards an undergraduate degree program appropriate credit for a student's military experience, following an evaluation and determination by the institution that the credits are in alignment with appropriate courses and correspond to the degree being pursued at the institution. The institution may award a maximum of 30 credits for military experience towards an undergraduate degree to a student enrolled in the institution.

Each public and independent institution of higher education, after taking into account and giving due consideration to the credit recommendation of the American Council on Education, shall accept and apply towards a graduate degree program appropriate credit for a student's military experience, following an evaluation and determination by the institution that the credits are in alignment with appropriate courses and correspond to the degree being pursued at the institution. The institution may award a maximum of 12 credits for military experience towards a graduate degree to a student enrolled in the institution.

The credit recommendation of the American Council on Education <sup>2</sup>[shall represent] represents <sup>2</sup> college-level equivalencies based on a review of workforce training, military training or occupations, and other sources of learning outside the college classroom.

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1	b. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require any
2	public or independent institution of higher education to admit a
3	student or to waive its admission standards and application
4	procedures.
5	c. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a public
6	or independent institution from accepting and applying towards a
7	degree program more than 30 <sup>2</sup> undergraduate degree credits, or 12
8	graduate degree <sup>2</sup> credits <sup>2</sup> , for a student's military experience
9	should the institution choose to take such action.

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11 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall first apply to 12 the first full academic year following the date of enactment.
