AN ACT concerning gun safety instruction for certain students and 1 2 supplementing chapter 35 of Title 18A of the New Jersey 3 Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey: 6 7 8 1. The Legislature finds and declares that: 9 The National Rifle Association created the Eddie Eagle a Gunsafe Program in 1988 to promote the protection and safety of 10 children; 11 12 b. The Eddie Eagle Gunsafe Program does not make value 13 judgements as to whether guns are good or bad, but rather promotes 14 the safety of children by teaching elementary school students how 15 to respond if they encounter a firearm; Under the Eddie Eagle Gunsafe Program, students are taught 16 c. 17 that, if they encounter a fiream, they should follow four simple 18 rules: (1) Stop; (2) Don't Touch; (3) Leave the Area; and (4) Tell an 19 Adult; and d. Real firearms are never used in the instruction, and the 20 program is endorsed by law enforcement agencies across the United 21 22 States as an effective method for providing elementary school 23 students with gun safety education. 24 25 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 35 36 37 38 **STATEMENT** 39 This bill requires a school district that includes grades 40 41 kindergarten through six to implement the Eddie Eagle Gunsafe 42 Program. The purpose of the educational program is to promote the 43 safety and protection of children and to emphasize how students 44 should respond if they encounter a firearm. A school district may 45 not use or include a firearm or demonstrate the use of a firearm 46 when teaching the program.
