Requires hospitals and homeless shelters to provide information on services and resources to individuals who are homeless or military veterans.

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AN ACT concerning services and resources for veterans and the
 homeless and supplementing Title 26 and Title 55 of the Revised
 Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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8 1. A general acute care hospital licensed pursuant to P.L.1971, 9 c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.) shall, as part of the patient intake process, 10 inquire as to whether the individual who is to receive services from the hospital is homeless or is a military veteran. In the event that 11 12 the individual responds in the affirmative, the hospital shall provide 13 the individual with information concerning special services and 14 resources that are available to the individual based on the 15 individual's status as homeless or as a military veteran. Each 16 general acute care hospital licensed in this State shall establish 17 standard protocols and procedures for making inquiries and 18 providing information as required by this section.

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2. An emergency shelter for the homeless established pursuant 20 to P.L.1985, c.48 (C.55:13C-1 et seq.) shall, as part of the client 21 22 intake process, inquire as to whether the individual who is to 23 receive services is a military veteran. In the event that the 24 individual responds in the affirmative, the shelter shall provide the 25 individual with information concerning special services and resources that are available to the individual based on the 26 individual's status as a military veteran. Each emergency shelter 27 for the homeless established in this State shall establish standard 28 29 protocols and procedures for making inquiries and providing 30 information as required by this section.

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32 3. The Commissioner of Health and the Commissioner of 33 Community Affairs shall, pursuant to the "Administrative 34 Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), adopt any 35 rules and regulations as each commissioner deems necessary to 36 carry out the provisions of this act.

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4. This act shall take effect on the first day of the fourth month
next following the date of enactment, except that the Commissioner
of Health and the Commissioner of Community Affairs may take
any anticipatory administrative action in advance as shall be
necessary for the implementation of this act.
