SYNOPSIS

Requires Department of Education to develop guidelines for school districts concerning child trafficking awareness and prevention.

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AN ACT ²[establishing the Child Trafficking Awareness Pilot
 Program in the Department of Education] <u>concerning child</u>
 <u>trafficking awareness for school districts</u>² and supplementing
 chapter ²[6] <u>36</u>² of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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9 ²[1. a. The Commissioner of Education shall develop and administer a three-year Child Trafficking Awareness Pilot Program 10 to provide school district staff $\frac{1}{2}$ and students $\frac{1}{2}$ in selected districts 11 with training ¹[on how to identify and respond to child trafficking] 12 about the warning signs and risk factors associated with child 13 14 trafficking and how to prevent child trafficking¹. The commissioner shall select two districts in each of the southern, 15 central, and northern regions of the State to participate in the 16 17 program and shall seek a cross section of school districts from 18 urban, suburban, and rural areas of the State.

19 b. The purpose of the pilot program shall be to train public school teachers¹[and],¹ staff ¹[on], and students about child 20 trafficking, including risk factors and warning signs, and¹ ways to 21 identify student victims of child trafficking and help prevent child 22 23 trafficking in schools. The program shall include information ¹<u>based on reseach</u>¹ that promotes a greater understanding of: risk 24 factors that make children more susceptible to becoming a victim of 25 26 child trafficking; recruitment methods of traffickers; behavioral 27 indicators that a student may be a victim of possible child trafficking; ¹[and]¹ how to report suspected cases of child 28 trafficking to school administrators and law enforcement¹; and 29 strategies to prevent children from becoming victims of child 30 trafficking¹. 31

c. The commissioner shall provide pilot districts with ¹<u>a list of</u>
resources from established and reliable sources for training public
school teachers, staff, and students, as well as ¹ sample school
policies and protocols for identifying a suspected victim of child
trafficking and responding to a disclosure from a student that he is a
victim of child trafficking.

d. At the conclusion of the pilot program, the commissioner shall submit a report to the Governor, and to the Legislature pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1). The report shall contain information on the implementation of the pilot program and shall include the commissioner's recommendation on the feasibility of implementing the program on a Statewide basis. **]**²

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²1. a. The Department of Education, in consultation with the 1 2 Office of the Attorney General and the Department of Children and Families, shall develop and distribute to school districts guidelines 3 concerning child trafficking. The purpose of the guidelines shall be 4 5 to provide direction for schools in creating awareness of child trafficking, including warning signs and risk factors associated with 6 child trafficking and how to prevent child trafficking. 7 b. The guidelines shall include, but not be limited to, research-8 9 based information and guidance regarding the following: 10 (1) definitions and terms relevant to an understanding of child 11 trafficking; (2) resources and information to provide training for teachers, 12 staff, and students regarding child trafficking; 13 14 (3) resources and information to create a greater understanding of risk factors that make children more susceptible to becoming a 15 16 victim of child trafficking, recruitment of traffickers, and behavioral indicators that a student may be a victim of possible 17 18 child trafficking; 19 (4) how to report a suspected case of child trafficking to school 20 administrators and law enforcement; 21 (5) strategies to prevent children from becoming victims of 22 child trafficking; and (6) procedures for ensuring confidentiality and privacy.² 23 24 25 ²2. The Commissioner of Education shall provide school 26 districts with guidance and resources regarding the following: a. professional development opportunities for teachers, 27 28 administrators, guidance counselors, coaches, and other school staff 29 regarding issues and concerns relevant to child trafficking 30 awareness; and b. developmentally appropriate resources regarding child 31 trafficking awareness.² 32 ²[2.] $3.^{2}$ This act shall take effect ²[in the first full school year 34 following the date of enactment] immediately². 35

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
