**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

8 1. a. A county government, municipal government, or any 9 agency or instrumentality thereof, including a county improvement 10 authority, municipal economic development entity, and public or 11 private economic development organization, or any combination 12 thereof, may join together and enter into an agreement to establish a 13 regional economic development partnership for the purpose of 14 engaging in joint regional economic planning and formulating an 15 economic development or redevelopment strategy which may 16 include, but not be limited to, assisting existing businesses, 17 attracting new businesses, providing incentives to retain existing 18 businesses in the region, redeveloping existing areas or facilities, 19 and sharing costs of a project or projects.

20 b. A regional economic development partnership may also 21 include businesses, business organizations, educational institutions, 22 nonprofit organizations, and other entities located within the region. 23 Regional economic development partnerships formed pursuant to 24 this section may be registered with the New Jersey Economic 25 Development Authority and may cooperate with, and utilize the 26 economic development resources, of the authority. If a constituent 27 member of a partnership is a public entity within the jurisdiction of 28 the Department of Community Affairs, the partnership agreement 29 shall be submitted to the department for approval before it is 30 certified by the authority. Every partnership agreement shall 31 contain provisions for the creation of a board representing the 32 members of the partnership to oversee the partnership's affairs.

c. Regional economic development partnerships may be
eligible for loans or any available matching grants in order to carry
out marketing, advertising, and promotional programs to further
their activities, promote business growth and to assist existing
businesses within the region.

38 d. Notwithstanding the foregoing, counties and municipalities, 39 jointly or severally, may enter into an agreement other than a formal 40 regional economic development partnership arrangement for the 41 purpose of engaging in joint economic planning, implementing an 42 economic development strategy, or any other economic 43 development or redevelopment project or projects, including the 44 sharing of the cost of the project or projects pursuant to a resolution 45 or ordinance, as appropriate, adopted by the participating governing 46 bodies. Local units that have negotiated an agreement pursuant to 47 this subsection shall submit the proposed agreement to the Local 48 Finance Board for approval.

2. This act shall take effect on the first day of the seventh
 month next following the date of enactment, but the New Jersey
 Economic Development Authority and the Local Finance Board
 may take such anticipatory administrative action in advance thereof
 as shall be necessary for the implementation of this act.

#### STATEMENT

10 This bill authorizes local governmental entities to enter into regional economic development partnerships for the purpose of 11 engaging in joint regional economic planning and formulating an 12 13 economic development or redevelopment strategy. Under the bill, 14 regional economic development partnerships could include any 15 combination of county governments, municipal governments, 16 agencies or instrumentalities thereof, and public or private 17 economic development organization. A regional economic development partnership may also include businesses, business 18 19 organizations, educational institutions, nonprofit organizations, and 20 other entities located within the region.
