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AN ACT establishing a Campus Sexual Assault Commission and
 supplementing chapter 3B of Title 18A of the New Jersey
 Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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8 1. a. There is established a Campus Sexual Assault
9 Commission in, but not of, the Department of State. The
10 commission shall consist of 12 members including:

(1) the Secretary of Higher Education, the Attorney General,
and the Director of the Division on Women in the Department of
Children and Families, or their designees, who shall serve ex
officio;

(2) five public members appointed by the Governor, including a
representative of the State colleges and universities established
pursuant to chapter 64 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, a
representative of the public research universities, a representative of
the county colleges, a representative of the independent colleges
and universities, and a representative of the New Jersey Coalition
Against Sexual Assault; and

(3) four public members with demonstrated expertise or interest
in issues related to the work of the commission, including at least
one individual who is a campus sexual assault survivor. The
President of the Senate, the Speaker of the General Assembly, the
Minority Leader of the Senate, and the Minority Leader of the
General Assembly shall each appoint one of these public members.

28 The public members shall serve for a term of three years, but b. 29 of the members first appointed: three of the members appointed by 30 the Governor shall serve for a term of three years; one of the members appointed by the Governor, the member appointed by the 31 32 President of the Senate, and the member appointed by the Speaker 33 of the General Assembly shall serve for a term of two years; and 34 one of the members appointed by the Governor, the member 35 appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate, and the member 36 appointed by the Minority Leader of the General Assembly shall 37 serve for a term of one year.

c. Vacancies in the membership of the commission shall be
filled in the same manner as the original appointments are made and
a member may be eligible for reappointment. Vacancies occurring
other than by expiration of a term shall be filled for the unexpired
term.

d. The members of the commission shall serve without
compensation but shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses
necessarily incurred in the performance of their duties within the
limits of funds appropriated or otherwise made available to the
commission for its purposes.

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2. The commission shall organize as soon as practicable 1 2 following the appointment of its members, but no later than 60 days 3 after the effective date of this act. The commission shall choose a 4 chairperson from among its members and shall appoint a secretary 5 who need not be a member of the commission. The commission shall meet quarterly, at a minimum. 6 7 8 3. The Office of the Secretary of Higher Education shall provide such stenographic, clerical, and other administrative 9 assistants, and such professional staff as the commission requires to 10

carry out its work. The commission also shall be entitled to call to
its assistance and avail itself of the services of the employees of any
State, county, or municipal department, board, bureau, commission,
or agency as it may require and as may be available for its purposes.

4. It shall be the responsibility of the commission to further the
work of the Task Force on Campus Sexual Assault established
pursuant to P.L.2015, c.165. In particular, the commission shall:

a. study and evaluate emerging issues, policies, and practicesconcerning campus sexual assault;

b. monitor the response to, and implementation of, the
recommendations put forth in the report issued by the task force
established pursuant to P.L.2015, c.165;

c. supplement the findings and recommendations, as necessary,
of the report issued by the task force established pursuant to
P.L.2015, c.165;

d. develop and administer, in consultation with the Secretary of
Higher Education, a campus climate survey every three years; and

e. develop an action plan every three years that includes
policies, programs, or procedures responsive to the issues and needs
identified in the campus climate survey.

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5. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

This bill establishes in, but not of, the Department of State, a
Campus Sexual Assault Commission. The commission will consist
of 12 members including:

(1) the Secretary of Higher Education, the Attorney General,
and the Director of the Division on Women in the Department of
Children and Families, or their designees, who will serve ex officio;
(2) five public members appointed by the Governor, including a
representative of the State colleges and universities, a representative
of the public research universities, a representative of the county
colleges, a representative of the independent colleges and

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universities, and a representative of the New Jersey Coalition 1 2 Against Sexual Assault; and 3 (3) four public members with demonstrated expertise or interest 4 in issues related to the work of the commission, including at least 5 one individual who is a campus sexual assault survivor. The President of the Senate, the Speaker of the General Assembly, the 6 Minority Leader of the Senate, and the Minority Leader of the 7 8 General Assembly will each appoint one of these public members. 9 Public members will serve for a term of three years. 10 The bill requires the commission to organize as soon as practicable, but no later than 60 days after the effective date of the 11 bill's enactment. The commission will meet quarterly, at a 12 13 minimum. 14 The bill provides that it will be the responsibility of the 15 commission to further the work of the Task Force on Campus Sexual Assault established pursuant to P.L.2015, c.165. 16 In 17 particular, the commission is required to: 18 study and evaluate emerging issues, policies, and • 19 practices concerning campus sexual assault; monitor the response to, and implementation of, the 20 21 recommendations put forth in the report issued by the task 22 force; supplement the findings and recommendations, as 23 necessary, of the report issued by the task force; 24 develop and administer, in consultation with the Secretary 25 of Higher Education, a campus climate survey every three 26 27 years; and 28 develop an action plan every three years that includes policies, programs, or procedures responsive to the issues 29 and needs identified in the campus climate survey. 30
