Permits operation of low-speed electric bicycles.

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AN ACT concerning electric bicycles, amending R.S.39:1-1, and 1 2 supplementing Title 39 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. R.S.39:1-1 is amended to read as follows: 8 39:1-1. As used in this subtitle, unless other meaning is clearly 9 apparent from the language or context, or unless inconsistent with the manifest intention of the Legislature: 10 "Alley" means a public highway wherein the roadway does not 11 12 exceed 12 feet in width. 13 "Authorized emergency vehicles" means vehicles of the fire 14 department, police vehicles and such ambulances and other vehicles 15 as are approved by the chief administrator when operated in 16 response to an emergency call. 17 "Autocycle" means a three-wheeled motorcycle designed to be 18 controlled with a steering wheel and pedals in which the operator 19 and passenger may ride in a completely or partially enclosed seating area that is equipped with a roll cage or roll hoops, safety seat belts 20 for each occupant, and anti-lock brakes. 21 22 "Automobile" includes all motor vehicles except motorcycles. 23 "Berm" means that portion of the highway exclusive of roadway 24 and shoulder, bordering the shoulder but not to be used for 25 vehicular travel. 26 "Business district" means that portion of a highway and the territory contiguous thereto, where within any 600 feet along such 27 28 highway there are buildings in use for business or industrial 29 purposes, including but not limited to hotels, banks, office 30 buildings, railroad stations, and public buildings which occupy at 31 least 300 feet of frontage on one side or 300 feet collectively on 32 both sides of the roadway. 33 "Car pool" means two or more persons commuting on a daily 34 basis to and from work by means of a vehicle with a seating 35 capacity of nine passengers or less. 36 "Chief Administrator" or "Administrator" means the Chief 37 Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission. 38 "Commercial motor vehicle" includes every type of motor-driven 39 vehicle used for commercial purposes on the highways, such as the transportation of goods, wares and merchandise, excepting such 40 41 vehicles as are run only upon rails or tracks and vehicles of the 42 passenger car type used for touring purposes or the carrying of farm 43 products and milk, as the case may be.

"Commission" means the New Jersey Motor Vehicle
 Commission established by section 4 of P.L.2003, c.13 (C.39:2A 4).

4 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Transportation of5 this State.

6 "Commuter van" means a motor vehicle having a seating 7 capacity of not less than seven nor more than 15 adult passengers, 8 in which seven or more persons commute on a daily basis to and 9 from work and which vehicle may also be operated by the driver or 10 other designated persons for their personal use.

"Crosswalk" means that part of a highway at an intersection, 11 12 either marked or unmarked existing at each approach of every roadway intersection, included within the connections of the lateral 13 14 lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured 15 from the curbs or, in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the 16 shoulder, or, if none, from the edges of the roadway; also, any 17 portion of a highway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly 18 indicated for pedestrian crossing by lines or other marking on the 19 surface.

"Curb extension" or "bulbout" means a horizontal extension of
the sidewalk into the street which results in a narrower roadway
section.

"Dealer" includes every person actively engaged in the business
of buying, selling or exchanging motor vehicles or motorcycles and
who has an established place of business.

26 "Deputy Chief Administrator" means the deputy chief27 administrator of the commission.

"Driver" means the rider or driver of a horse, bicycle or
motorcycle or the driver or operator of a motor vehicle, unless
otherwise specified.

31 "Explosives" means any chemical compound or mechanical 32 mixture that is commonly used or intended for the purpose of producing an explosion and which contains any oxidizing and 33 34 combustive units or other ingredients in such proportions, quantities 35 or packing that an ignition by fire, friction, by concussion, by 36 percussion, or by detonator of any part of the compound or mixture 37 may cause such a sudden generation of highly heated gases that the 38 resultant gaseous pressures are capable of producing destructive 39 effects on contiguous objects or of destroying life or limb.

40 "Farm tractor" means every motor vehicle designed and used
41 primarily as a farm implement for drawing plows, mowing
42 machines, and other implements of husbandry.

43 "Flammable liquid" means any liquid having a flash point below
44 200 degrees Fahrenheit, and a vapor pressure not exceeding 40
45 pounds.

46 "Gross weight" means the combined weight of a vehicle and a47 load thereon.

"High occupancy vehicle" or "HOV" means a vehicle which is
used to transport two or more persons and shall include public
transportation, car pool, van pool, and other vehicles as determined
by regulation of the Department of Transportation.
"Highway" means the entire width between the boundary lines of
every way publicly maintained when any part thereof is open to the
use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel.

8 "Horse" includes mules and all other domestic animals used as9 draught animals or beasts of burden.

"Inside lane" means the lane nearest the center line of theroadway.

"Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation
of the lateral curb lines or, if none, the lateral boundary lines of two
or more highways which join one another at an angle, whether or
not one such highway crosses another.

16 "Laned roadway" means a roadway which is divided into two or17 more clearly marked lanes for vehicular traffic.

18 "Leased limousine" means any limousine subject to regulation in19 the State which:

a. Is offered for rental or lease, without a driver, to be operated
by a limousine service as the lessee, for the purpose of carrying
passengers for hire; and

b. Is leased or rented for a period of one year or morefollowing registration.

"Leased motor vehicle" means any motor vehicle subject toregistration in this State which:

a. Is offered for rental or lease, without a driver, to be operated
by the lessee, his agent or servant, for purposes other than the
transportation of passengers for hire; and

30 b. Is leased or rented for a period of one year or more31 following registration.

32 "Limited-access highway" means every highway, street, or 33 roadway in respect to which owners or occupants of abutting lands 34 and other persons have no legal right of access to or from the same 35 except at such points only and in such manner as may be 36 determined by the public authority having jurisdiction over such 37 highway, street, or roadway; and includes any highway designated 38 as a "freeway" or "parkway" by authority of law.

39 "Local authorities" means every county, municipal and other
40 local board or body having authority to adopt local police
41 regulations under the Constitution and laws of this State, including
42 every county governing body with relation to county roads.

43 <u>"Low-speed electric bicycle" means a two or three-wheeled</u>
44 <u>vehicle with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than</u>
45 750 watts, whose maximum speed on a paved level surface, when
46 powered solely by a motor while operated by a person weighing 170

47 pounds, is less than 20 miles per hour.

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"Low-speed vehicle" means a four-wheeled low-speed vehicle, 1 2 as defined in 49 [CFR] C.F.R. s.571.3(b), whose attainable speed is 3 more than 20 miles per hour but not more than 25 miles per hour on 4 a paved level surface and which is not powered by gasoline or 5 diesel fuel and complies with federal safety standards as set forth in 6 49 [CFR] <u>C.F.R.</u> s.571.500. 7 "Magistrate" means any municipal court and the Superior Court, 8 and any officer having the powers of a committing magistrate and 9 the chief administrator. 10 "Manufacturer" means a person engaged in the business of manufacturing or assembling motor vehicles, who will, under 11 normal business conditions during the year, manufacture or 12 13 assemble at least 10 new motor vehicles. 14 "Metal tire" means every tire the surface of which in contact with 15 the highway is wholly or partly of metal or other hard nonresilient 16 material. 17 "Mid-block crosswalk" means a crosswalk located away from an intersection, distinctly indicated by lines or markings on the 18 19 surface. "Motorized bicycle" means a pedal bicycle having a helper motor 20 21 characterized in that either the maximum piston displacement is less 22 than 50 cc. or said motor is rated at no more than 1.5 brake horsepower or is powered by an electric drive motor and said 23 24 bicycle is capable of a maximum speed of no more than 25 miles per hour on a flat surface. This term shall not include a low-speed 25 electric bicycle as defined in this section. 26 27 "Motorcycle" includes motorcycles, autocycles, motor bikes, 28 bicycles with motor attached and all motor-operated vehicles of the 29 bicycle or tricycle type, except motorized bicycles and low-speed 30 electric bicycles as defined in this section, whether the motive 31 power be a part thereof or attached thereto and having a saddle or 32 seat with driver sitting astride or upon it or a platform on which the 33 driver stands. 34 "Motor-drawn vehicle" includes trailers, semitrailers, or any 35 other type of vehicle drawn by a motor-driven vehicle. 36 "Motor vehicle" includes all vehicles propelled otherwise than by 37 muscular power, excepting such vehicles as run only upon rails or tracks, low-speed electric bicycles, and motorized bicycles. 38 39 "Motorized scooter" means a miniature motor vehicle and includes, but is not limited to, pocket bikes, super pocket bikes, 40 41 scooters, mini-scooters, sport scooters, mini choppers, mini 42 motorcycles, motorized skateboards and other vehicles with motors 43 not manufactured in compliance with Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards and which have no permanent Federal Safety 44 45 Certification stickers affixed to the vehicle by the original 46 manufacturer. This term shall not include: electric personal assistive mobility devices, motorized bicycles [or], low-speed 47 48 vehicles, or low-speed electric bicycles; or motorized wheelchairs,

mobility scooters or similar mobility assisting devices used by
 persons with physical disabilities, or persons whose ambulatory
 mobility has been impaired by age or illness.

4 "Motorized skateboard" means a skateboard that is propelled5 otherwise than by muscular power.

6 "Motorized wheelchair" means any motor-driven wheelchair 7 utilized to increase the independent mobility, in the activities of 8 daily living, of an individual who has limited or no ambulation 9 abilities, and includes mobility scooters manufactured specifically 10 for such purposes and designed primarily for indoor use.

"Noncommercial truck" means every motor vehicle designed
primarily for transportation of property, and which is not a
"commercial vehicle."

"Official traffic control devices" means all signs, signals,
markings, and devices not inconsistent with this subtitle placed or
erected by authority of a public body or official having jurisdiction
for the purpose of regulating, warning, or guiding traffic.

18 "Omnibus" includes all motor vehicles used for the 19 transportation of passengers for hire, except commuter vans and 20 vehicles used in ridesharing arrangements and school buses, if the 21 same are not otherwise used in the transportation of passengers for 22 hire.

"Operator" means a person who is in actual physical control of avehicle or street car.

25 "Outside lane" means the lane nearest the curb or outer edge of26 the roadway.

27 "Owner" means a person who holds the legal title of a vehicle, or 28 if a vehicle is the subject of an agreement for the conditional sale or 29 lease thereof with the right of purchase upon performance of the 30 conditions stated in the agreement and with an immediate right of possession vested in the conditional vendee or lessee, or if a 31 32 mortgagor of a vehicle is entitled to possession, then the conditional vendee, lessee or mortgagor shall be deemed the owner for the 33 34 purpose of this subtitle.

"Parking" means the standing or waiting on a street, road or
highway of a vehicle not actually engaged in receiving or
discharging passengers or merchandise, unless in obedience to
traffic regulations or traffic signs or signals.

39 "Passenger automobile" means all automobiles used and
40 designed for the transportation of passengers, other than omnibuses
41 and school buses.

42 "Pedestrian" means a person afoot.

43 "Person" includes natural persons, firms, copartnerships,44 associations, and corporations.

45 "Pneumatic tire" means every tire in which compressed air is46 designed to support the load.

47 "Pole trailer" means every vehicle without motive power48 designed to be drawn by another vehicle and attached to the towing

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vehicle by means of a reach, or pole, or by being boomed or
 otherwise secured to the towing vehicle, and ordinarily used for
 transporting long or irregularly shaped loads, such as poles, pipes,
 or structural members capable, generally, of sustaining themselves
 as beams between the supporting connections.

6 "Private road or driveway" means every road or driveway not7 open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel.

8 "Railroad train" means a steam engine, electric or other motor,
9 with or without cars coupled thereto, operated upon rails, except
10 street cars.

"Recreation vehicle" means a self-propelled or towed vehicle
equipped to serve as temporary living quarters for recreational,
camping or travel purposes and used solely as a family or personal
conveyance.

"Residence district" means that portion of a highway and the
territory contiguous thereto, not comprising a business district,
where within any 600 feet along such highway there are buildings
in use for business or residential purposes which occupy 300 feet or
more of frontage on at least one side of the highway.

"Ridesharing" means the transportation of persons in a motor
vehicle, with a maximum carrying capacity of not more than 15
passengers, including the driver, where such transportation is
incidental to the purpose of the driver. The term shall include such
ridesharing arrangements known as car pools and van pools.

25 "Right-of-way" means the privilege of the immediate use of the26 highway.

"Road tractor" means every motor vehicle designed and used for
drawing other vehicles and not so constructed as to carry any load
thereon either independently or any part of the weight of a vehicle
or load so drawn.

"Roadway" means that portion of a highway improved, designed,
or ordinarily used for vehicular travel, exclusive of the berm or
shoulder. In the event a highway includes two or more separate
roadways, the term "roadway" as used herein shall refer to any such
roadway separately, but not to all such roadways, collectively.

"Safety zone" means the area or space officially set aside within
a highway for the exclusive use of pedestrians, which is so plainly
marked or indicated by proper signs as to be plainly visible at all
times while set apart as a safety zone.

40 "School bus" means every motor vehicle operated by, or under 41 contract with, a public or governmental agency, or religious or other 42 charitable organization or corporation, or privately operated for the 43 transportation of children to or from school for secular or religious 44 education, which complies with the regulations of the New Jersey 45 Motor Vehicle Commission affecting school buses, including 46 "School Vehicle Type I" and "School Vehicle Type II" as defined 47 below:

1 "School Vehicle Type I" means any vehicle designed to transport 2 16 or more passengers, including the driver, used to transport 3 enrolled children, and adults only when serving as chaperones, to or 4 from a school, school connected activity, day camp, summer day 5 camp, summer residence camp, nursery school, child care center, 6 preschool center or other similar places of education. Such vehicle 7 shall comply with the regulations of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle 8 Commission and either the Department of Education or the 9 Department of Human Services, whichever is the appropriate 10 supervising agency.

11 "School Vehicle Type II" means any vehicle designed to transport less than 16 passengers, including the driver, used to 12 transport enrolled children, and adults only when serving as 13 14 chaperones, to or from a school, school connected activity, day 15 camp, summer day camp, summer residence camp, nursery school, 16 child care center, preschool center or other similar places of 17 education. Such vehicle shall comply with the regulations of the 18 New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission and either the Department 19 of Education or the Department of Human Services, whichever is 20 the appropriate supervising agency.

"School zone" means that portion of a highway which is either contiguous to territory occupied by a school building or is where school crossings are established in the vicinity of a school, upon which are maintained appropriate "school signs" in accordance with specifications adopted by the chief administrator and in accordance with law.

27 "School crossing" means that portion of a highway where school
28 children are required to cross the highway in the vicinity of a
29 school.

"Semitrailer" means every vehicle with or without motive power,
other than a pole trailer, designed for carrying persons or property
and for being drawn by a motor vehicle and so constructed that
some part of its weight and that of its load rests upon or is carried
by another vehicle.

35 "Shipper" means any person who shall deliver, or cause to be 36 delivered, any commodity, produce or article for transportation as 37 the contents or load of a commercial motor vehicle. In the case of a 38 sealed ocean container, "shipper" shall not be construed to include 39 any person whose activities with respect to the shipment are limited 40 to the solicitation or negotiation of the sale, resale, or exchange of 41 the commodity, produce or article within that container.

42 "Shoulder" means that portion of the highway, exclusive of and
43 bordering the roadway, designed for emergency use but not
44 ordinarily to be used for vehicular travel.

45 "Sidewalk" means that portion of a highway intended for the use
46 of pedestrians, between the curb line or the lateral line of a
47 shoulder, or if none, the lateral line of the roadway and the adjacent
48 right-of-way line.

1 "Sign." See "Official traffic control devices."

2 "Slow-moving vehicle" means a vehicle run at a speed less than3 the maximum speed then and there permissible.

4 "Solid tire" means every tire of rubber or other resilient material
5 which does not depend upon compressed air for the support of the
6 load.

7 "Street" means the same as highway.

8 "Street car" means a car other than a railroad train, for 9 transporting persons or property and operated upon rails principally 10 within a municipality.

11 "Stop," when required, means complete cessation from12 movement.

"Stopping or standing," when prohibited, means any cessation of
movement of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when
necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with
the directions of a police officer or traffic control sign or signal.

17 "Suburban business or residential district" means that portion of 18 highway and the territory contiguous thereto, where within any 1,320 feet along that highway there is land in use for business or 20 residential purposes and that land occupies more than 660 feet of 21 frontage on one side or collectively more than 660 feet of frontage 22 on both sides of that roadway.

"Through highway" means every highway or portion thereof at
the entrances to which vehicular traffic from intersecting highways
is required by law to stop before entering or crossing the same and
when stop signs are erected as provided in this chapter.

27 "Trackless trolley" means every motor vehicle which is propelled
28 by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires but not
29 operated upon rails.

30 "Traffic" means pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles,
31 street cars, and other conveyances either singly, or together, while
32 using any highway for purposes of travel.

33 "Traffic control signal" means a device, whether manually,
34 electrically, mechanically, or otherwise controlled, by which traffic
35 is alternately directed to stop and to proceed.

36 "Trailer" means every vehicle with or without motive power,
37 other than a pole trailer, designed for carrying persons or property
38 and for being drawn by a motor vehicle and so constructed that no
39 part of its weight rests upon the towing vehicle.

40 "Truck" means every motor vehicle designed, used, or41 maintained primarily for the transportation of property.

"Truck tractor" means every motor vehicle designed and used
primarily for drawing other vehicles and not so constructed as to
carry a load other than a part of the weight of the vehicle and load
so drawn.

46 "Van pooling" means seven or more persons commuting on a
47 daily basis to and from work by means of a vehicle with a seating
48 arrangement designed to carry seven to 15 adult passengers.

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"Vehicle" means every device in, upon or by which a person or 1 2 property is or may be transported upon a highway, excepting 3 devices moved by human power or used exclusively upon stationary 4 rails or tracks or motorized bicycles. 5 (cf: P.L.2016, c.35, s.1) 6 7 (New section) a. A low-speed electric bicycle, as defined in 2. 8 R.S.39:1-1, may be operated on the streets, highways, sidewalks, and bicycle paths of this State. 9 b. The operator of a low-speed electric bicycle shall not be 10 required to register the low-speed electric bicycle, furnish proof of 11 insurance, or have a driver's license. 12 c. All statutes, including the provisions of chapter 4 of Title 39 13 14 of the Revised Statutes, rules, and regulations applicable to 15 bicycles, as defined in section 1 of P.L.1991, c.465 (C.39:4-10.1), shall apply to low-speed electric bicycles. 16 17 18 3. This act shall take effect immediately. 19 20 **STATEMENT** 21 22 23 This bill expressly permits the operation of low-speed electric 24 bicycles in this State. Under the bill, low-speed electric bicycles 25 may be operated on streets, highways, sidewalks, and bicycle paths. 26 An operator of a low-speed electric bicycle is not required to register the low-speed electric bicycle, furnish proof of insurance, 27 28 or have a driver's license. 29 The bill further provides that all statutes, including the 30 provisions of chapter 4 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, rules, and regulations that are applicable to bicycles are to apply to low-31 32 speed electric bicycles. The bill defines a low-speed electric bicycle as a two or three-33 34 wheeled vehicle with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of 35 less than 750 watts, whose maximum speed on a paved level 36 surface, when powered solely by a motor while operated by a person weighing 170 pounds, is less than 20 miles per hour. 37 The bill also clarifies that the definitions of a motor vehicle, 38 39 motorcycle, motorized bicycle, and motorized scooter do not 40 include a low-speed electric bicycle.
