Establishes licensure for master hearth professionals.

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1 AN ACT concerning the licensure of master hearth professionals and 2 amending and supplementing P.L.1968, c.362. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 2 of P.L.1968, c.362 (C.45:14C-2) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 When used in this act, 10 (a) "Master plumber" means a person licensed pursuant to this 11 amendatory and supplementary act who has the qualifications, 12 training, experience and technical knowledge necessary to properly 13 plan, lay out, install and repair plumbing apparatus and equipment 14 and to supervise others in the performance of such work in 15 accordance with standards, rules and regulations established by the 16 State board; 17 (b) "State board" means the State Board of Examiners of Master 18 Plumbers established pursuant to section 3 of P.L.1968, c.362 19 (C.45:14C-3); 20 (c) "Act" means this act and the rules and regulations adopted 21 under it; 22 (d) "Bona fide representative" means a licensed master plumber 23 who is the holder of not less than 10% of the issued and outstanding 24 shares of stock in a corporation, or not less than 10% of the capital 25 of a partnership, or not less than 10% of the ownership of any other 26 firm or legal entity engaging in the business of plumbing 27 contracting in the State of New Jersey; (e) "Apprentice plumber" means any person other than a master 28 29 plumber or journeyman plumber who as his principal occupation is 30 engaged in learning and assisting in the installation of plumbing; 31 (f) "Journeyman plumber" means any person other than a 32 master plumber or apprentice plumber who installs, alters, repairs 33 and renovates plumbing in accordance with standards, rules and 34 regulations established by the board and who works under the 35 supervision of a master plumber; 36 (g) "Plumbing" means the practice, materials and fixtures used 37 in the installation, maintenance, extension, alteration, repair and 38 removal of all piping, plumbing fixtures, plumbing appliances and 39 plumbing apparatus in connection with any of the following: 40 sanitary drainage, storm facilities and building sewers to their 41 respective final connection to an approved point of disposal, 42 venting systems, public and private water supply systems of any 43 premises to and within the property line of any building, structure 44 or conveyance to their final connection with an approved supply 45 system. Plumbing shall also mean the practice and materials used EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

in the installation, maintenance, extension, alteration, repair or
 removal of storm water, refrigeration and air conditioning drains,
 liquid waste or sewage;

4 (h) "Plumbing contractor" means any licensed master plumber, 5 firm, partnership, corporation or other legal entity which undertakes 6 or offers to undertake for another the planning, laying out, 7 supervising, installing or making of additions, alterations and 8 repairs in the installation of plumbing. In order to act as "a 9 plumbing contractor," a licensed master plumber shall be the holder 10 of not less than 10% of the issued and outstanding shares of stock in 11 the corporation, or not less than 10% of the capital of the 12 partnership, or not less than 10% of the ownership of any other firm or legal entity engaging in the business of plumbing contracting in 13 14 the State and shall employ either journeymen plumbers or 15 apprentice plumbers or both;

(i) "Barbecue appliance" means an appliance that cooks food by
 applying heat as a result of burning solid fuel, gas fuel, natural gas,
 propane gas, wood fuel, or pellet fuel;

(j) "Hearth product appliance" means a fireplace, fireplace
insert, stove or log set that offers a decorative view of the flames,
and may include a passive or powered air vent heated by the flames,
a convection chamber for the purpose of heating the room air by the
means of gravity, or a manufacturer approved or supplied fan, and
may be fueled by solid fuel, gas fuel, natural gas, propane gas,
wood fuel, or pellet fuel;

26 (k) "Hearth professional work" means the installation, 27 replacement, connection, venting, inspection, repair, maintenance, 28 or servicing of hearth product appliances, barbecue appliances, 29 outdoor patio appliances, and space heater appliances, and shall 30 include the installation, inspection, repair, or servicing of vents, 31 vent connectors, masonry, metal and factory built chimney and vent systems, natural or manufactured gas piping on the load side of the 32 33 meter, as well as making any electrical connection necessary for the 34 proper functioning of the aforementioned appliances;

35 (1) "Master hearth professional" means a person licensed
36 pursuant to P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as
37 this bill) who has the qualifications, training, experience and
38 technical knowledge necessary to engage in hearth professional
39 work;
40 (m) "Outdoor patio appliance" means an appliance that is located

41 <u>outdoors, and includes free standing, mounted or built-in</u>
42 <u>appliances, stoves, fireplaces, fire pits, inserts, and gas logs, and</u>
43 <u>may be fueled by solid fuel, gas fuel, natural gas, propane gas,</u>
44 <u>wood fuel, or pellet fuel;</u>

45 (n) "Space heater appliance" means an appliance that provides
46 heat to a designated area by the means of thermal radiation or
47 convection, and includes free standing, mounted or built-in
48 appliances, stoves, fireplaces, inserts, and gas logs, and may be

1 fueled by solid fuel, gas fuel, natural gas, propane gas, wood fuel, 2 or pellet fuel. 3 (cf: P.L.1987, c.442, s.1) 4 5 2. Section 3 of P.L.1968, c.362 (C.45:14C-3) is amended to 6 read as follows: 7 There is created hereunder a State Board of Examiners of 8 Master Plumbers in the Department of Law and Public Safety, 9 consisting of [7] 9 citizens to be appointed by the Governor, 10 without regard to political affiliation, and except as to members first appointed, for terms of 4 years and until the appointment of their 11 successors. Of the members first appointed 2 shall be appointed for 12 13 terms of 1 year, 2 for 2 years, 2 for 3 years and one for 4 years. 14 Three members shall be master plumbers of at least 10 years 15 experience, one shall be a local plumbing inspector who has held 16 such appointment for at least 10 years, one shall be a journeyman 17 plumber of at least 10 years experience, 2 shall be master hearth 18 professionals of at least 10 years hearth professional work 19 experience, and 2 shall be representatives of the public having no 20 association with the plumbing industry. 21 No member shall be eligible for appointment for more than 2 22 terms. Appointments to fill vacancies on the board shall be made 23 for the remainder of the unexpired term. 24 Members of the board shall be subject to removal by the 25 Governor for cause. 26 (cf: P.L.1968, c.362, s.3) 27 28 3. (New section) Any person desiring to obtain a State master 29 hearth professional's license shall make application for licensure to 30 the State board and shall pay all the fees required in connection 31 with the application. 32 33 4. (New section) A person shall not work as a master hearth 34 professional or use the title or designation of "licensed master hearth professional" or "master hearth professional" unless licensed 35 pursuant to the provisions of P.L., c. (C. 36) (pending before 37 the Legislature as this bill). 38 39 5. (New section) Nothing in P.L. , c. (C.) (pending 40 before the Legislature as this bill) shall be construed to prevent any 41 person licensed by the State, including, but not limited to, 42 architects, professional engineers, electrical contractors, master 43 plumbers, or any chimney service professional registered as a home 44 improvement contractor with the Division of Consumer Affairs, 45 from acting within the scope of practice of the respective profession 46 or occupation, but no person shall use the designation "licensed 47 master hearth professional" or "master hearth professional" unless

(New section) a. The provisions of P.L. , c. (C.) 5 (pending before the Legislature as this bill) shall not deny to any 6 municipality the power to inspect hearth professional work or the 7 equipment of a master hearth professional, or the power to enforce 8 the standards and manner in which hearth professional work shall 9 be done, but no municipality, local board of health or other agency 10 shall require any master hearth professional licensed under P.L. 11) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) to obtain c. The State board shall ensure that master hearth professionals 15 comply with all applicable requirements of building codes, gas 16 codes, and any other industry standards deemed appropriate by the 17 State board. 18 19 7. (New section) Every person desiring to apply for a State master hearth professional's license, who shall meet the 20 21 qualifications as set forth herein, shall deliver to the State board, 22 personally or by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage 23 prepaid, a certified check or money order payable to the Treasurer 24 of the State of New Jersey in the required amount, together with the 25 written application required by the State board, completed as 26 described in the application, and together with proof of qualification 27 as described herein. 28 The qualifications for a master hearth professional's license 29 shall be as follows: 30 a. the person shall be 21 or more years of age; 31 b. the person shall be a citizen or legal resident of the United States: 32 33 c. the person shall possess a valid master hearth professional 34 certification issued by the National Fireplace Institute or an 35 equivalent authority approved by the State board; and 36 d. the person shall have been engaged or employed in hearth 37 professional work for a period of five years preceding the date of 38 the person's application for licensure. 39 Proof of compliance with the qualifications shall be submitted to 40 the State board in writing, sworn to by the applicant, and the written 41 proof shall be accompanied by two recent photographs of the 42 applicant. 43 44 8. (New section) Every State license issued pursuant to P.L. 45) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) shall c. (C. 46 automatically expire on June 30 following the date of its issuance. 47 Licenses may be renewed biennially by the State board upon written 48 application of the holder and payment of the prescribed fee.

9. (New section) a. The State board shall require each master
 hearth professional, as a condition of license renewal, to complete
 any continuing education requirements imposed by the State board
 pursuant to subsection b. of this section.

b. The State board shall establish standards for continuing
master hearth professional education, including the subject matter
and content of courses of study, the selection of instructors, and the
number and type of continuing education credits required of a
master hearth professional as a condition of license renewal.

c. The State board shall not require completion of continuing
master hearth professional education credits for an initial renewal of
license.

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14 10. (New section) The provisions of P.L., c. (C.)
15 (pending before the Legislature as this bill) shall not apply to a
16 single family home owner who performs hearth professional work
17 on the person's own dwelling.

- 19 11. Section 2 of this act shall take effect immediately and the
 20 remainder of this act shall take effect on the 120th day next
 21 following enactment, except the State Board of Examiners of
 22 Master Plumbers may take any anticipatory administrative action in
 23 advance as shall be necessary for the implementation of this act.
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STATEMENT

This bill amends and supplements "The State Plumbing License 28 29 Law of 1968" to provide for the licensure of master hearth 30 professionals. To be eligible for licensure as a master hearth professional, an applicant must be at least 21 years of age, be a 31 32 United States citizen or a legal resident, possess a valid master 33 hearth professional certification from a nationally recognized body, 34 and have at least five years of experience engaged in hearth 35 professional work. The bill also adds two members to the State 36 Board of Examiners of Master Plumbers who are master hearth 37 professionals with at least 10 years of experience in hearth 38 professional work.

39 "Hearth professional work" is defined in the bill as the 40 installation, replacement, connection, venting, inspection, repair, 41 maintenance, or servicing of hearth product appliances, barbecue 42 appliances, outdoor patio appliances, and space heater appliances, and shall include the installation, inspection, repair, or servicing of 43 44 vents, vent connectors, masonry, metal and factory built chimney 45 and vent systems, natural or manufactured gas piping on the load 46 side of the meter, as well as making any electrical connection 47 necessary for the proper functioning of the aforementioned appliances. Hearth professional work must comply with all 48

1 applicable requirements of building codes, gas codes, and any other

2 industry standards deemed appropriate by the State board.

3 The bill provides that no person is permitted to work as a master 4 hearth professional or use the title or designation of "licensed 5 master hearth professional" or "master hearth professional" unless 6 licensed pursuant to the provisions of the bill. Furthermore, no 7 provision of the bill is to be construed to prevent any person 8 licensed by the State, including, but not limited to, architects, 9 professional engineers, electrical contractors, master plumbers, or 10 any chimney service professional registered as a home improvement 11 contractor with the Division of Consumer Affairs, from acting 12 within the scope of practice of the respective profession or 13 occupation, but no person may use the designation "licensed master hearth professional" unless licensed as a master hearth professional 14 15 under the provisions of the bill.

16 The provisions of the bill do not prohibit a municipality from 17 inspecting hearth professional work or the equipment of a master 18 hearth professional, or from enforcing the standards and manner in 19 which hearth professional work may be done. However, no 20 municipality, local board of health or other agency is permitted to 21 require a master hearth professional licensed under the bill to obtain 22 any additional license, apply for or take any examination, or pay 23 any licensing fee.

24 The bill requires each master hearth professional, as a condition 25 of license renewal, to complete any continuing education 26 requirements imposed by the State board. The State board must 27 establish standards for continuing master hearth professional education, including the subject matter and content of courses of 28 29 study, the selection of instructors, and the number and type of 30 continuing education credits required of a master hearth 31 professional as a condition of license renewal.

Finally, the provisions of the bill do not apply to a single family
home owner who performs hearth professional work on the person's
own dwelling.
