SYNOPSIS

Requires State entities to recycle certain materials and provide recycling bins in State buildings.

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1 AN ACT concerning recycling in State buildings and supplementing 2 Title 52 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. In addition to the requirements of any other law, rule, 8 regulation, or order, within one year after the effective date of this 9 act, each State entity shall: 10 (1) provide for the source separation and recycling of any 11 recyclable aluminum, corrugated cardboard, glass, paper, or plastic 12 waste generated at each building or facility owned, leased, or operated by the State entity; 13 14 (2) establish procedures for the collection and storage of any 15 materials to be recycled pursuant to subsection a. of this section, 16 and make necessary contractual arrangements for the collection, 17 transportation, and recycling of those materials by individuals or 18 entities licensed to do so; and 19 (3) provide adequate receptacles, signage, recycling 20 information, education, and staffing at each building or facility owned, leased, or operated by the State entity to ensure compliance 21 22 with this section. Receptacles shall be made available to both State 23 employees and members of the public. 24 b. Within 180 days after the effective date of this act, the 25 Department of the Treasury, in consultation with the Department of 26 Environmental Protection, shall prepare and distribute guidance to 27 assist State entities in complying with the requirements of this 28 section. 29 c. The Department of the Treasury and the Department of Environmental Protection shall work with the Administrative Office 30 of the Courts and the Legislature to ensure compliance with the 31 requirements of this section by the Judicial and Legislative 32 33 Branches of State Government, respectively. 34 d. The Department of the Treasury shall, in consultation with 35 the Department of Environmental Protection, adopt, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et 36 37 seq.), any rules and regulations necessary for the implementation of this act. 38 39 e. As used in this section, "State entity" means any branch, 40 department, agency, or office of State government, including a State 41 university or college, or an authority created by the State. 42 43 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 44 45 46 **STATEMENT** 47 48 This bill would require State governmental entities to source 49 separate and recycle any aluminum, corrugated cardboard, glass,

1 paper, or plastic waste generated at buildings and facilities owned,

2 leased, or operated by the State.

Under the bill, every State entity would also be required to 3 4 establish procedures for the collection and storage of any materials 5 to be recycled under the bill, and make necessary contractual 6 arrangements for the collection, transportation, and recycling of 7 those materials. State entities would be required as well to provide 8 adequate receptacles, signage, information, education, and staffing 9 at buildings and facilities owned, leased, or operated by the State 10 entities to ensure compliance with the bill.

11 The Department of the Treasury, in consultation with the 12 Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), would be required 13 to prepare and distribute guidance to assist State entities with 14 compliance. In addition, the Department of the Treasury and the 15 DEP would be required to work with the Administrative Office of the Courts and the Legislature to ensure compliance with the 16 requirements of the bill by the Judicial and Legislative Branches of 17 18 State Government, respectively.
