Increases hourly limit of reimbursable personal care assistant services under NJ WorkAbility Program.

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1 AN ACT concerning the NJ WorkAbility Program and 2 supplementing Title 30 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Services provided to employed, permanently-disabled individuals through the NJ WorkAbility Program, established 8 9 pursuant to P.L.2000, c.116, and in accordance with the federal 10 "Ticket to Work and Work Incentives Improvement Act of 1999," 11 Pub.L.106-170, shall be provided by health maintenance 12 organizations and fee-for-service providers that have executed a 13 contract with the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services in the Department of Human Services to provide benefits 14 15 through the State Medicaid program, established pursuant to 16 P.L.1968, c.413 (C.30:4D-1 et seq.), except that reimbursable 17 personal care assistant services shall be limited to a maximum of 18 112 hours per calendar work week. 19 20 2. The Commissioner of Human Services shall apply for such State plan amendments or waivers as may be necessary to 21 22 implement the provisions of this act and to secure federal financial 23 participation for State Medicaid expenditures under the federal 24 Medicaid program. 25 26 3. The Commissioner of Human Services shall adopt rules and regulations pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," 27 P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), to effectuate the purposes of 28 29 this act. 30 31 4. This act shall take effect immediately, and shall apply to any contract executed on or after the effective date of this act between 32 the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services in the 33 34 Department of Human Services and a health maintenance organization or a fee-for-service provider that provides benefits 35 through the State Medicaid program, established pursuant to 36 37 P.L.1968, c.413 (C.30:4D-1 et seq.). 38 39 40 **STATEMENT** 41 42 This bill increases the hourly limit of reimbursable personal care assistant services under the NJ WorkAbility Program from 40 hours 43 44 per calendar workweek to 112 hours per calendar workweek. The 45 NJ WorkAbility Program provides full State Medicaid health 46 coverage to individuals with disabilities who are working and whose 47 earnings would otherwise make them ineligible for Medicaid. The regulations (N.J.A.C.10:72-9 et seq.) governing the Program provide 48

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that all services available through the NJ WorkAbility Program must be provided through existing Medicaid contracts held by the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services (DMAHS) in the Department of Human Services. Currently, the reimbursement of personal care assistant services under such contracts is limited to 40 hours per calendar work week.

7 Individuals must meet the following guidelines in order to be eligible for the NJ WorkAbility Program: 1) be between the ages of 16 8 9 and 64; 2) work part time, full time, or be self-employed and have 10 proof of employment; 3) have a permanent disability as determined by 11 the United States Social Security Administration or the Disability 12 Review Team in DMAHS; and 4) have an earned income below 250 percent, and an unearned income below 100 percent, of the federal 13 14 poverty level. An individual participating in the program must pay a 15 \$25 monthly premium in order to receive full Medicaid coverage.
