SYNOPSIS

Establishes "Voting Precinct Transparency Act;" requires filing of election district, county district, and municipal ward boundary data with Secretary of State for posting and download on official website with matching election results data.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

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AN ACT concerning the availability of election district, county
 district, municipal ward boundary, and election results data to
 the public, amending various parts of the statutory law, and
 supplementing chapter 4 of Title 19 of the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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9 1. (New section) a. This act shall be known and may be cited 10 as the "Voting Precinct Transparency Act."

11 b. The Secretary of State shall make available on the official 12 website of the Division of Elections in the Department of State the 13 election district, county district, and municipal ward boundaries required to be filed with the Secretary of State pursuant to section 7 14 15 of P.L.1976, c.83 (C.19:4-16), section 121 of P.L.1972, c.154 16 (C.40:41A-121), and section 7 of P.L.1981, c.496 (C.40:44-15), 17 respectively. The boundary files shall be in ESRI Shapefile format 18 and available for download by the public free of charge.

19 c. Within 90 days following the certification of the results of 20 any special, primary, school, municipal, or general election, and of 21 any public question voted by the voters at an election, pursuant to 22 Title 19 of the Revised Statutes, the Secretary of State shall also 23 make available on the official website as provided under subsection 24 b. of this section a table or database containing the election results 25 compiled at the election districts level. The election results table or 26 database shall be in a single file, in a comma-delimited values 27 format, and shall contain a unique identifier field for each election district that matches the unique identifier field for that district in the 28 29 election districts Shapefile. The election results table or database 30 shall be available for download by the public free of charge.

d. The Secretary of State, in consultation with the New Jersey
Office of Information Technology, Office of Geographic
Information Systems, shall issue technical guidelines governing the
preparation, maintenance, and submission of boundary files and
election results files deemed necessary or desirable to accomplish
the provisions of this section.

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38 2. Section 7 of P.L.1976, c.83 (C.19:4-16) is amended to read 39 as follows:

7. <u>a.</u> The county board shall cause to have prepared and shall
maintain an up-to-date suitable map of the county and of each
constituent municipality clearly delineating the geographical
boundaries of each election district contained therein and of the
ward, legislative, freeholder, Congressional or other district or part
thereof, in which each election district is contained. A word

1 description of such geographical boundaries shall be attached to 2 each such map. 3 The county board shall file copies of such maps and descriptions 4 in the following manner: three copies to the Secretary of State, one 5 copy to the county clerk, and one copy to the clerk of each affected 6 municipality. Within 30 days of any changes in the boundaries of 7 any of the aforementioned districts, the county board shall file 8 revised maps and accompanying revised descriptions in the same 9 manner. 10 Said maps and descriptions shall be public records and shall be 11 available for inspection by the public in the offices of the Secretary 12 of State, county clerks and municipal clerks during normal office hours. Copies shall be made available to the public for a fee 13 necessary to cover the cost of reproduction. 14 15 In order to effectuate the purposes of this act, the Secretary of 16 State shall establish such rules and regulations governing the 17 preparation, maintenance, distribution and filing of said maps and 18 descriptions as he deems necessary or desirable. 19 b. In addition to the maps and descriptions required to be filed 20 with the Secretary of State under subsection a. of this section, the 21 county board shall file with the Secretary of State the election 22 district boundaries in ESRI Shapefile format in accordance with 23 section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this 24 bill). 25 (cf: P.L.1976, c.83, s.7) 26 27 3. Section 121 of P.L.1972, c.154 (C.40:41A-121) is amended 28 to read as follows: 29 121. a. Within 30 days after the adoption of one of said optional 30 plans, the district commissioners shall make and file their report and certificate over at least three of their signatures setting forth 31 32 and properly describing the district boundaries fixed and 33 determined, to which there shall be annexed a map of the county 34 with the district boundaries clearly marked thereon. 35 The report so certified shall be filed in the office of the clerk of 36 the county, and a copy thereof shall also be filed with the Secretary 37 of State. 38 b. In addition to the description of the district boundaries and 39 map required to be filed with the Secretary of State under 40 subsection a. of this section, the district commissioners shall file 41 with the Secretary of State the district boundaries in ESRI Shapefile 42 format in accordance with section 1 of P.L., c. 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1 7. a. Within 30 days following their initial meeting pursuant to 2 section 5 of this act, the ward commissioners shall file their report, 3 certified by at least three of their signatures, setting forth and 4 properly describing the ward boundaries fixed and determined. 5 There shall be annexed to the report a map of the municipality with 6 the ward boundaries clearly marked thereon. 7 The report so certified shall be filed in the office of the county 8 clerk, and copies shall be filed with the Secretary of State and in the 9 office of the municipal clerk. 10 b. In addition to the description of the ward boundaries and map 11 required to be filed with the Secretary of State under subsection a. 12 of this section, the ward commissioners shall file with the Secretary 13 of State the ward boundaries in ESRI Shapefile format in 14 accordance with section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the 15 Legislature as this bill). 16 (cf: P.L.1981, c.496, s.7) 17 18 5. This act shall take effect immediately. 19 20 21 **STATEMENT** 22 23 This act, to be known as the "Voting Precinct Transparency 24 Act," requires the filing of election district, county district, and 25 municipal ward boundary data with the Secretary of State for 26 posting and download online. The bill also requires the secretary to post as a single file a table or database containing the election results at the election districts level, in a manner that matches the 29 election districts boundary data. 30 Under current law, all municipalities in New Jersey are divided into election districts for election administration and voting 32 purposes. For counties and municipalities that have adopted an 33 optional charter as a form of government, current law also provides 34 that those counties and municipalities may choose in their charter to 35 be divided into county districts or municipal wards for the purpose 36 of electing members of the governing body to represent those 37 districts or wards. Currently, Essex, Atlantic, and Hudson counties 38 are divided into county districts from which voters elect some or all 39 of the members of the county governing body. Of the State's 565 40 municipalities, about 64 have chosen to establish municipal wards 41 from which voters elect some or all of the members of the 42 municipal governing body. 43 This bill requires each districting authority (county board of

44 elections for election districts, district commissioners for county 45 districts, and ward commissioners for municipal wards) to file with 46 the Secretary of State the election district, county district, and 47 municipal ward boundary data, as appropriate, in ESRI Shapefile 48 format. This file format is widely used with geographic information

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1 systems software. The Secretary of State is directed to make this boundary data available on the official website of the Division of 2 3 Elections for download by the public free of charge. The bill also 4 requires the secretary, within 90 days following the certification of 5 the results of any election, or public question voted on by the 6 voters, to make available on the same website a table or database 7 containing the election results compiled at the election districts 8 level. The election results table or database would be in a single 9 file, in a comma-delimited values format, and would contain a 10 unique identifier field for each election district that matches the unique identifier field for that district in the election districts 11 12 Shapefile. The election results table or database would also be 13 available for download by the public free of charge.

The bill directs the Secretary of State, in consultation with the New Jersey Office of Information Technology, Office of Geographic Information Systems, to issue technical guidelines governing the preparation, maintenance, and submission of boundary files and election results files deemed necessary or desirable to accomplish the provisions of the bill.
