- 1. The Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the Community FoodBank of New Jersey, shall:
- a. establish a public awareness campaign to educate the general public about food waste prevention by raising awareness regarding:
- (1) strategies to reduce wasteful shopping which may include the benefits of creating a shopping list;
 - (2) the benefits of freezing meat close to the expiration date; and
- (3) the meaning of date ¹[labels] <u>label</u> ¹ definitions such as "use by," "sell by," and "best buy";
- b. take appropriate measures to encourage the reduction of food waste through donating or composting leftover food; and
- c. develop and distribute appropriate informational materials regarding food waste, which may include, but need not be limited to, the use of social media, television, radio, or print media.
