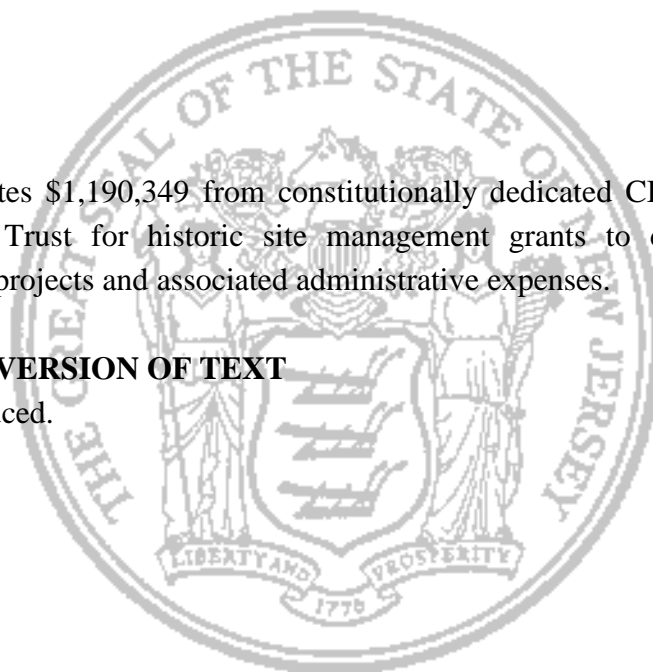

Appropriates \$1,190,349 from constitutionally dedicated CBT revenues to NJ Historic Trust for historic site management grants to certain historic preservation projects and associated administrative expenses.

A4734 LAND, TALIAFERRO

1 AN ACT appropriating \$1,190,349 from constitutionally dedicated
2 corporation business tax revenues for the purpose of providing
3 grants, as awarded by the New Jersey Historic Trust, for certain
4 historic preservation projects and associated administrative
5 expenses.

7 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
8 of New Jersey:

9
10 1. a. There is appropriated to the New Jersey Historic Trust the
11 following sums for the purpose of providing historic site
12 management grants as listed in subsection b. of this section as
13 awarded by the New Jersey Historic Trust, for historic preservation
14 projects approved as eligible for such funding:

15 (1) \$1,026,621 from dedicated corporation business tax
16 revenues pursuant to Article VIII, Section II, paragraph 6 of the
17 State Constitution in the “Preserve New Jersey Historic
18 Preservation Fund,” established pursuant to section 9 of the
19 “Preserve New Jersey Act,” P.L.2016, c.12 (C.13:8C-51); and

20 (2) \$11,000 from the unexpended balances of dedicated
21 corporation business tax revenues pursuant to Article VIII, Section
22 II, paragraph 6 of the State Constitution in the Diesel Risk
23 Mitigation Fund - Constitutional Dedication account made available
24 for this purpose pursuant to the provisions of P.L.2018, c.53.

25 b. The following historic preservation projects are eligible for
26 funding in the form of historic site management grants, as awarded
27 by the New Jersey Historic Trust, using moneys appropriated
28 pursuant to subsection a. of this section:

4 c. Any transfer of any funds, or change in project sponsor, site,
5 or type, listed in subsection b. of this section shall require the
6 approval of the Joint Budget Oversight Committee or its successor.

7 d. To the extent that moneys remain available after the projects
8 listed in subsection b. of this section are offered funding pursuant
9 thereto, any project of a local government unit or qualifying tax
10 exempt nonprofit organization that previously received funding for
11 historic preservation purposes appropriated or reappropriated from
12 any Green Acres bond act, any annual appropriations act, or the
13 Garden State Historic Preservation Trust Fund established pursuant
14 to section 21 of P.L.1999, c.152 (C.13:8C-21), or that receives
15 funding pursuant to this act, shall be eligible to receive additional
16 funding, as determined by the New Jersey Historic Trust, subject to

1 the approval of the Joint Budget Oversight Committee or its
2 successor.

3 For the purposes of this subsection, "Green Acres bond act"
4 means P.L.2009, c.117, P.L.2007, c.119, P.L.1995, c.204, P.L.1992,
5 c.88, and P.L.1987, c.265.

6 e. The expenditure of moneys appropriated pursuant to this
7 section is subject to the provisions of the "Preserve New Jersey
8 Act," P.L.2016, c.12 (C.13:8C-43 et seq.).

9
10 2. There is appropriated from dedicated corporation business tax
11 revenues pursuant to Article VIII, Section II, paragraph 6 of the
12 State Constitution in the "Preserve New Jersey Historic
13 Preservation Fund," established pursuant to section 9 of the
14 "Preserve New Jersey Act," P.L.2016, c.12 (C.13:8C-51), to the
15 New Jersey Historic Trust the sum of \$152,728 for the purpose of
16 providing organizational, administrative and other work and
17 services, including salaries, equipment, materials and services
18 necessary to administer the applicable provisions of this act.

19
20 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the "Preserve
21 New Jersey Historic Preservation Fund," established pursuant to
22 section 9 of the "Preserve New Jersey Act," P.L.2016, c.12
23 (C.13:8C-51), the sum of \$1,179,349 to implement the provisions of
24 this act.

STATEMENT

30

31 The bill appropriates \$1,190,349 to the New Jersey Historic
32 Trust for the purpose of providing historic site management grants,
33 as awarded by the New Jersey Historic Trust, for certain historic
34 preservation projects contained in this bill, and associated
35 administrative expenses.

36 The funding in this bill is provided from constitutionally
37 dedicated corporation business tax (CBT) revenues pursuant to
38 Article VIII, Section II, paragraph 6 of the State Constitution,
39 approved by the voters of the State in November 2014, including
40 the unexpended balances in the Diesel Risk Mitigation Fund –
41 Constitutional Dedication account made available for these
42 purposes pursuant to P.L.2018, c.53 (i.e., the FY2019 annual
43 appropriations act). The "Preserve New Jersey Act" implements for
44 State fiscal years 2017 through 2019, the constitutional dedication
45 of CBT revenues for open space, farmland, and historic
46 preservation. Specifically, of the funding provided in this bill,
47 \$1,179,349 is from constitutionally dedicated CBT revenues in the
48 "Preserve New Jersey Historic Preservation Fund," and \$11,000 is

1 from the unexpended balances in the Diesel Risk Mitigation Fund –
2 Constitutional Dedication account. The “Preserve New Jersey
3 Historic Preservation Fund” was established by section 9 of the
4 “Preserve New Jersey Act.”

5 The 33 projects listed in this bill have been approved by the New
6 Jersey Historic Trust and the Garden State Preservation Trust.

7 Historic site management grants support non-construction
8 activities. Of the projects in this bill: 29 grants will help fund
9 preservation planning projects such as condition assessments,
10 historic structure reports, archaeological investigations, and
11 construction documents; and four grants will help fund projects to
12 improve visitors’ experience at historic sites by assessing heritage
13 tourism potential and creating interpretive plans and signage. All
14 the grants require a match from the recipient. All of the properties
15 are listed or eligible to be listed in the New Jersey and National
16 Register of Historic Places, either individually or within designated
17 historic districts, and the project names in the bill are the names of
18 the properties as they are listed in the National Register of Historic
19 Places and may not reflect the current names of the property.

20 The bill also provides that any transfer of any funds to another
21 project, or change in project sponsor, site, or type, listed in the bill
22 would require the approval of the Joint Budget Oversight
23 Committee. The bill further provides that to the extent there are
24 funds remaining after those projects listed in this bill are offered
25 funding, the New Jersey Historic Trust, with the approval of the
26 Joint Budget Oversight Committee, may use those funds to provide
27 additional funding for historic preservation projects of local
28 government units or qualifying tax-exempt nonprofit organizations
29 previously approved for funding pursuant to various other laws or
30 approved for funding pursuant to this bill.

31 Lastly, this bill appropriates \$152,728 from the “Preserve New
32 Jersey Historic Preservation Fund” to the New Jersey Historic Trust
33 for the purpose of providing funding for the organizational,
34 administrative and other work and services, including salaries,
35 equipment, materials and services necessary to administer the
36 applicable provisions of this bill.
