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SYNOPSIS

Requires DHS to ensure medication assisted treatment benefits under Medicaid program are provided without the imposition of prior authorization requirements.

1 AN ACT concerning medication assisted treatment for substance use 2 disorders and supplementing P.L.1968, c.413 (C.30:4D-1 et 3 seq.).

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 8 1. a. Notwithstanding any State law or regulation to the contrary, 9 the Department of Human Services shall ensure that the provision of 10 benefits for ¹ [medication assisted treatment] naltrexone, combination 11 buprenorphine, drugs containing buprenorphine and naloxone, and, if authorized by the Commissioner 12 13 of Human Services, other medications approved by the federal Food 14 and Drug Administration for the treatment of substance use disorders, 15 to eligible persons receiving services funded by the Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services in the Department of Human Services 16 as well as 1 to eligible persons under the Medicaid program, established 17 pursuant to P.L.1968, c.413 (C.30:4D-1 et seq.), shall be provided 18 without the imposition of any prior authorization requirements ¹[or 19 other prospective utilization management requirements 11, provided 20 that the treatment is prescribed ¹or administered ¹ by a licensed medical 21 22 who is authorized to prescribe ¹ [methadone, 23 buprenorphine, and naltrexone and provided by a licensed health care 24 professional or a licensed or certified substance use disorder provider 25 in a licensed or otherwise State-approved facility, as required by the laws of the state in which the treatment is rendered or administer that 26 27 treatment pursuant to State and federal law. The Commissioner of 28 Human Services may develop and issue guidelines to ensure the safety and efficacy of benefits provided pursuant to this section¹. 29
 - b. As used in this ¹[Act] <u>act</u>¹:

¹["Medication assisted treatment" means the use of methadone, buprenorphine, naltrexone to provide a comprehensive approach to the treatment of substance use disorders.]1

"Substance use disorder" is as defined by the American Psychiatric Association in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Fifth Edition and any subsequent editions and shall include substance use withdrawal.

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The Commissioner of Human Services shall apply for such State plan amendments or waivers as may be necessary to implement the provisions of this act and to secure federal financial participation for State Medicaid expenditures under the federal Medicaid program.

1 3. The Commissioner of Human Services, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-2 1 et seq.), shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to implement 4 the provisions of this act.
