SYNOPSIS

Requires Commissioner of Health to establish maternity care public health campaign.

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1 AN ACT regarding maternity care and supplementing Title 26 of the 2 **Revised Statutes.** 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. The Commissioner of Health shall establish a maternity 8 public health campaign, which shall, at a minimum: 9 a. encourage the public to access a user-friendly website, that 10 is created and maintained by the Commissioner and which uses 11 comparative data on maternal outcomes and information to help 12 mothers choose maternal care providers and birthing locations; b. disseminate aggregated data to the public regarding: rates of 13 14 Cesarean births, breast feeding, and vaginal birth after cesarean 15 delivery; 16 promote the use of shared decision-making models and c. 17 decision-making aids; 18 d. disseminate information to healthcare professionals 19 regarding how to document preferred care in health records; 20 disseminate information to the public on becoming engaged e in maternity care, making informed choices, patient rights, 21 experiencing physiological processes before and after birth, 22 23 avoiding interventions, and using high-value forms of care such as 24 midwives, birthing centers, doulas, and lactation support; 25 promote the Commissioner's Community Health Workers f. 26 and Central Intake Programs through the Improving Pregnancy 27 Outcomes Initiative or a successor program; g. provide information on the department's Internet website 28 29 regarding parents' rights to family leave pursuant to P.L.2008, c.17 (C.43:21-39 et al.), the "Family Leave Act," P.L.1989, c.261 30 (C.34:11B-1 et seq.), and 29 U.S.C. 2601 et seq., the federal Family 31 32 and Medical Leave Act; 33 h. information about breastfeeding and pregnancy 34 discrimination rights pursuant to P.L.2013, c.220; and 35 information about edibility and the application process for i. the Medically Needy program under the federal Medicaid program 36 37 for pregnant women. 38 39 2. The Department of Health shall adopt rules and regulations, 40 pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 41 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), to implement the provisions of section 1 of 42 this act. 43 44 3. This act shall take effect 180 days after the date of 45 enactment.

STATEMENT

3 This bill requires the Commissioner of Health (commissioner) to4 establish a maternity public health campaign.

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5 Under the bill, the commissioner is to, at a minimum: (1) 6 encourage the public to access a user-friendly website, that is 7 created and maintained by the commissioner and which uses 8 comparative data on maternal outcomes and information to help 9 mothers choose maternal care providers and birthing locations; (2) 10 disseminate aggregated data to the public regarding: rates of 11 Cesarean births, breast feeding, and vaginal birth after cesarean 12 delivery; (3) promote the use of shared decision-making models and 13 decision-making aids; (4) disseminate information to healthcare 14 professionals regarding how to document preferred care in health 15 records; (5) disseminate information to the public on becoming 16 engaged in maternity care, making informed choices, experiencing 17 physiologic processes before and after birth, avoiding interventions, 18 using high-value forms of care such as midwives, birthing centers, 19 doulas, and lactation support, and patient rights; (6) promote the 20 Commissioner's Community Health Workers and Central Intake 21 Programs through the Improving Pregnancy Outcomes Initiative or 22 a successor program; (7) provide information on the department's 23 Internet website regarding parents' rights to family leave in New 24 Jersey and the federal programs for pregnant women; (8) 25 information about breastfeeding and pregnancy discrimination 26 rights pursuant to P.L.2013, c.220; and (9) information about 27 edibility and the application process for the Medically Needy 28 program under the federal Medicaid program for pregnant women.
