AN ACT requiring the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce

 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
 of New Jersey:

The Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development, in 9 consultation with the New Jersey Commission on Science, 10 Innovation and Technology, shall conduct a study on the impact of 11 artificial intelligence-powered technology and automation on 12 economic growth and shall prepare and submit a written report, within one year of the effective date of this act, to the Governor 13 and, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the 14 15 Legislature, the chairperson of the Assembly Science, Innovation, 16 and Technology Committee and the chairperson of the Senate 17 Economic Growth Committee, or their successor committees, which 18 shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

a. the predicted impact of artificial intelligence on the labor
market for highly-skilled and highly-educated professionals, such as
doctors, lawyers, data analysts, and similarly skilled workers;

b. the occupations or industries most impacted by an expansionof the use of artificial intelligence;

c. the implications of these findings on the long-term plans for
educating the next generation of highly-skilled employees;

d. new professions that may come into existence as a result of
the expansion of the use of artificial intelligence and automation;
and

e. the impact of artificial intelligence on labor productivity andeconomic growth.

33 the submission of the written report to the Governor and the

STATEMENT

39 This bill requires the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce 40 Development, in consultation with the Commission on Science, 41 Innovation and Technology to conduct a study on the economic 42 impacts of artificial intelligence on economic growth pertaining to 43 white collar professions, and then prepare and submit a written 44 report to the Governor and the Legislature on the topic. This subject 45 has not received attention in most previous investigations on the 46 topic, but is important considering recent technological advances.

47 The written report is to include the predicted impact of artificial48 intelligence on the market for white-collar positions and other
