#### **SYNOPSIS**

Directs Department of Agriculture to establish grant program for counties to study and develop methods of tick control; appropriates \$1 million.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. The Department of Agriculture shall establish a pilot program to provide grants to counties in the State to develop and study methods for tick control. Grants shall be awarded to programs that aim to reduce the prevalence of tick-borne diseases by developing tick surveillance, management, and control methods, and by providing education, training, and pest management recommendations.
- b. In establishing the pilot program pursuant to this section, the department shall:
- (1) develop guidelines and procedures for the submission of grant applications, and criteria for the evaluation of such applications;
- (2) establish terms and conditions for the awarding of a grant under this section, and monitor grant recipients' compliance with the terms and conditions; and
- (3) require the recipient of a grant to report to the department information relating to its use of grant funds and the development of tick surveillance, management, and control methods under the program.
- c. No later than two years after the effective date of this act, the department shall submit a written report to the Legislature pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1) on the effectiveness of the grant program in the development of tick surveillance, management, and control methods.

2. There is appropriated \$1,000,000 to the Department of Agriculture from the General Fund to implement the provisions of this act.

3. This act shall take effect immediately, and shall expire upon the submittal by the department of the report required pursuant to subsection c. of section 1 of this act.

#### STATEMENT

This bill requires the Department of Agriculture to establish a pilot program that would award grants to counties and municipalities that wish to study and develop methods of tick control.

Under the bill, the department would establish the grant application process as well as terms and conditions for awarding

- 1 grants. Each recipient of a grant would be required to report to the
- 2 department on the status of its tick control program. After two
- 3 years, the department would be required to issue a report to the
- 4 Legislature about the effectiveness of the pilot program, which
- 5 would then expire.
- 6 The bill appropriates \$1 million dollars to the department to
- 7 administer the program and to award grants.
