SYNOPSIS

Requires certain long-term care facilities to submit outbreak response plan to DOH.

AN ACT concerning certain long-term care facilities and 1 2 supplementing Title 26 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. As used in this section: ¹"Cohor<u>ting</u>" means the practice of grouping patients who are or 8 are not colonized or infected with the same organism to confine 9 their care to one area and prevent contact with other patients. 10 ²<u>"Department" means the Department of Health.</u> 11 "Endemic level" means the usual level of given disease in a 12 geographic area.² 13 "Isolating" means the process of separating sick, contagious 14 persons from those who are not sick.¹ 15 "Long-term care facility" means a nursing home, assisted living 16 residence, comprehensive personal care home, residential health 17 18 care facility, or dementia care home licensed pursuant to P.L.1971, 19 c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.). ²"Long-term care facility that provides care to ventilator-20 dependent residents" means a long-term care facility that has been 21 22 licensed to provide beds for ventilator care. 23 "Outbreak" means any unusual occurrence of disease or any disease above background or endemic levels.² 24 b. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the 25 ²[Department of Health] <u>department</u>² shall require long-term care 26 facilities ¹[that provide care to ventilator-dependent residents]¹ to 27 28 develop ² [and submit to the department]² an outbreak response plan within 180 days after the effective date of this act, which plan 29 shall be customized to the facility, based upon national standards 30 and developed in consultation with the facility's infection control 31 committee², if the facility has established an infection control 32 committee². At a minimum, each facility's plan shall include, but 33 shall not be limited to: 34 35 (1) a protocol for isolating and cohorting infected and at-risk 36 patients in the event of an outbreak of a ¹[life-threatening,]¹ contagious disease ${}^{1}\mathbf{I}$, or of a similar health emergency at a 37 facility, **]**¹ until the cessation of the outbreak ¹[or emergency]¹; 38 (2) clear policies for the notification of ¹[patients, patients'] 39 residents, residents'¹ families, ¹visitors,¹ and staff in the event of an 40 outbreak of a 1 [life-threatening,] 1 contagious disease 1 [, or of a 41 similar health emergency]¹ at a facility; 42 (3) information on the availability of laboratory testing, 43 44 protocols for assessing whether facility visitors are ill, protocols to

require ill staff to not present at the facility for work duties, and
processes for implementing evidence-based outbreak response
measures;

4 (4) ²[policies to meet staffing, training, and facility demands

c. ²[Each long term care facility shall notify the department
¹[,]¹ on an annual basis ¹[unless otherwise required by the
department,] <u>thereafter</u>¹ of any material changes or updates to its
outbreak response plan. ¹<u>The department shall, within 180 days of</u>
<u>the submission of the outbreak plan, review the plan and ensure that</u>
all criteria are satisfied as set forth in this act]

24 (1) In addition to the requirements set forth in subsection b. of 25 this section, the department shall require long-term care facilities 26 that provide care to ventilator-dependent residents to include in the 27 facility's outbreak response plan written policies to meet staffing, 28 training, and facility demands during an infectious disease outbreak 29 to successfully implement the outbreak response plan, including 30 either employing on a full-time or part-time basis, or contracting 31 with on an consultative basis, the following individuals: 32 (a) an individual certified by the Certification Board of 33 Infection Control and Epidemiology; and 34 (b) a physician who has completed an infectious disease 35

<u>fellowship.</u>
(2) Each long-term care facility that provides care to ventilatordependent residents shall submit to the department the facility's
outbreak response plan within 180 days after the effective date of
this act.

40 (3) The department shall verify that the outbreak response plans
 41 submitted by long-term care facilities that provide care to
 42 ventilator-dependent residents are compliance with the requirements
 43 of subsection b. of this section and with the requirements of
 44 paragraph (1) of this subsection².¹

d. ²[The Department of Health shall develop and implement
procedures as are necessary for the submission of the long-term
care facility outbreak response plans required pursuant to this
section]

5 (1) Each long-term care facility that submits an outbreak
6 response plan to the department pursuant to subsection c. of this
7 section shall review the plan on an annual basis.

8 (2) If a long-term care facility that provides care to ventilator-9 dependent residents makes any material changes to its outbreak 10 response plan, the facility shall, within 30 days after completing the 11 material change, submit to the department an updated outbreak 12 response plan. The department shall, upon receiving an updated 13 outbreak response plan, verify that the plan is compliant with the 14 requirements of subsections b. and c. of this section².

Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Department of Health shall, no later than 180 days after the 16 17 submission of the outbreak response plan pursuant to subsection b. 18 of this section, issue a certificate of need to a long-term care facility 19 which the department determines is in need of a physical expansion 20 of its facilities to permit the long-term care facility to execute the 21 outbreak response plan submitted pursuant to subsection b. of this 22 section.

f. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, following the Department of Health's initial issuance of certificates of need pursuant to this section, the department shall triennially assess the State's need for additional space in long-term care facilities and issue certificates of need to facilities in need of physical expansion to permit long-term care facilities to execute an outbreak response plan submitted pursuant to this section. **]**¹

¹[g.] <u>e.</u>¹ (1) The ²[Department of Health] <u>department</u>² shall require a long-term care facility ¹[, which provides care to ventilator-dependent residents,]¹ ²<u>that provides care to ventilator-</u> <u>dependent residents</u>² to assign to the facility's infection control committee ¹, on a full-time or part-time basis, or on a consultative <u>basis</u>¹:
