SYNOPSIS

Permits municipalities to charge reduced or no beach fee for children ages 12 to 17; revises law concerning beach fees for veterans.

AN ACT concerning reduced beach fees and amending P.L.1955,
 c.49.
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4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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7 1. Section 1 of P.L.1955, c.49 (C.40:61-22.20) is amended to 8 read as follows:

9 1. a. The governing body of any municipality bordering on the 10 Atlantic Ocean, tidal water bays or rivers which owns or shall 11 acquire, by any deed of dedication or otherwise, lands bordering on 12 the ocean, tidal water bays or rivers, or easement rights therein, for 13 a place of resort for public health and recreation and for other 14 public purposes shall have the exclusive control, government and 15 care thereof and of any boardwalk, bathing and recreational 16 facilities, safeguards and equipment, now or hereafter constructed 17 or provided thereon, and may, by ordinance, make and enforce rules 18 and regulations for the government and policing of such lands, 19 boardwalk, bathing facilities, safeguards and equipment; provided, 20 that such power of control, government, care and policing shall not 21 be construed in any manner to exclude or interfere with the 22 operation of any State law or authority with respect to such lands, 23 property and facilities. Any such municipality may, in order to 24 provide funds to improve, maintain and police the same and to 25 protect the same from erosion, encroachment and damage by sea or 26 otherwise, and to provide facilities and safeguards for public 27 bathing and recreation, including the employment of lifeguards, by 28 ordinance, make and enforce rules and regulations for the 29 government, use, maintenance and policing thereof and provide for 30 the charging and collecting of reasonable fees for the registration of 31 persons using said lands and bathing facilities, for access to the 32 beach and bathing and recreational grounds so provided and for the 33 use of the bathing and recreational facilities, but no such fees shall 34 be charged or collected from children under the age of 12 years.

b. A municipality may by ordinance provide that no fees, orreduced fees, shall be charged to:

(1) persons 65 or more years of age;

spouse or dependent children over the age of 12 years. As used in
 this paragraph, "Initial Active Duty Training" means Basic Military
 Training, for members of the New Jersey Air National Guard, and
 Basic Combat Training and Advanced Individual Training, for
 members of the New Jersey Army National Guard;

6 (5) persons who have served in any of the Armed Forces of the 7 United States and who were discharged or released therefrom under 8 conditions other than dishonorable and who either have served at 9 least 90 days in active duty or have been discharged or released 10 from active duty by reason of a service-incurred injury or disability. 11 The Adjutant General of the New Jersey Department of Military 12 and Veterans' Affairs shall promulgate rules and regulations 13 pertaining to veteran eligibility under this paragraph; and]

(6) persons holding a driver's license or identification card with
a Gold Star Family designation issued pursuant to section 1 of
P.L.2013, c.165 (C.39:3-10f6) or section 2 of P.L.1980, c.47
(C.39:3-29.3), respectively ; and

18 (7) children between the ages of 12 and 17 years.

19 c. A municipality providing for no fees or reduced fees 20 pursuant to paragraph (3), (4), (5), or (6) of subsection b. of this 21 section shall track, in a manner deemed appropriate by the 22 governing body of the municipality, the number of persons who 23 qualify under the provisions of those paragraphs.

24 d. A person who qualifies for free access to beaches and 25 bathing and recreational grounds and free use of bathing and 26 recreational facilities pursuant to paragraph (3), (4), (5), or (6) of 27 subsection b. of this section may, in lieu of obtaining and presenting a municipal beach tag or similar admission pass to gain such access 28 29 and use, present a valid military identification card, form DD-214 30 or similar document, or State driver's license or identification card 31 indicating that the holder is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the 32 United States or a Gold Star Family member.

- 35 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
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STATEMENT

This bill would allow a municipality, by ordinance, to charge no
fee or a reduced beach fee to children between the ages of 12 and
17. This bill would also provide that a municipality, by ordinance,
may charge no fee or a reduced beach fee to honorably discharged
veterans, regardless of length of active duty or disability.

Under current law, a municipality, by ordinance, may charge no
fee or a reduced fee to: (1) persons 65 or more years of age; (2)
persons who meet the disability criteria for disability benefits under
Title II of the federal Social Security Act; (3) persons in active

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1 military service in any of the Armed Forces of the United States and 2 their spouse and dependent children over the age of 12 years; (4) 3 persons who are active members of the New Jersey National Guard 4 who have completed Initial Active Duty Training and their spouse 5 and dependent children over the age of 12 years; (5) persons who have served in any of the Armed Forces of the United States and 6 7 who were discharged or released therefrom under conditions other 8 than dishonorable and who either have served at least 90 days in 9 active duty or have been discharged or released from active duty by 10 reason of a service-incurred injury or disability; and (6) persons 11 holding a driver's license or identification card with a Gold Star 12 Family designation. This bill would expand the list of individuals who could receive 13

14 no fee or a reduced beach fee to children between the ages of 12 15 and 17. In addition, the bill would delete language in current law 16 limiting the exemption and reduced fee to veterans who have either 17 served at least 90 days in active duty or have been discharged or 18 released from active duty by reason of a service-incurred injury or 19 disability.
