#### **SYNOPSIS**

Establishes "New Jersey Advanced Autonomous Vehicle Task Force."

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As reported by the Senate Transportation Committee on January 17, 2019, with amendments.

**A JOINT RESOLUTION** establishing the "New Jersey Advanced Autonomous Vehicle Task Force."

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. There is established a task force to be known as <sup>1</sup>the<sup>1</sup> "New Jersey Advanced Autonomous Vehicle Task Force." The purpose of the task force shall be to conduct a study of advanced autonomous vehicles and to make recommendations on laws, rules, and regulations that this State may enact <sup>1</sup>or adopt <sup>1</sup> to safely integrate advanced autonomous vehicles on the State's highways, streets, and roads.
- b. The task force shall consist of '[7] '[eight] 11' members as follows:
  - (1) the Commissioner of Transportation, who shall serve ex officio, or the commissioner's designee;
  - (2) the Chief Administrator of the <sup>1</sup>New Jersey <sup>1</sup> Motor Vehicle Commission, who shall serve ex officio, or the chief administrator's designee;
  - (3) the Director of the Division of Highway Traffic Safety in the Department of Law and Public Safety, who shall serve ex officio, or the director's designee;
    - (4) <sup>1</sup>[two] <sup>2</sup>[three<sup>1</sup>] <u>a commissioner of the Board of Public Utilities, selected by the Governor, who shall serve ex officio, or that commissioner's designee;</u>
  - (5) five<sup>2</sup> public members, who shall be appointed by the Governor, one with an expertise in highway <sup>1</sup> [transportation] traffic<sup>1</sup> safety <sup>1</sup> [and], <sup>1</sup> one with an expertise in autonomous vehicle technology <sup>2</sup>, one with an expertise in automotive manufacturing, one who is licensed in this State as a professional engineer pursuant to P.L.1938, c.342 (C.45:8-27 et seq.)<sup>2</sup>, and one, who shall be appointed by the Governor upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of the Department of Banking and Insurance, with an expertise in automobile insurance<sup>1</sup>;
  - ${}^{2}[(5)] \underline{(6)}^{2}$  one public member appointed by the Governor upon the recommendation of the President of the Senate, with an expertise in highway  ${}^{1}[transportation] \underline{traffic}^{1}$  safety; and
  - <sup>2</sup>[(6)] (7)<sup>2</sup> one public member appointed by the Governor upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the General Assembly, with an expertise in autonomous vehicle technology <sup>2</sup>[;].<sup>2</sup>
- c. Within 90 days after the effective date of P.L., c. (C.)
  (pending before the Legislature as this bill), <sup>1</sup> a majority of <sup>1</sup> the

1 task force's authorized membership shall be appointed and the task 2 force shall hold its initial meeting. The task force shall organize 3 upon the appointment of a majority of its authorized membership 4 and shall elect a chair from among its members. The members of 5 the task force shall serve for the duration of the existence of the task 6 force. Any vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the 7 original appointment. The task force members shall serve without 8 compensation, but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses 9 incurred in the performance of their duties to the extent that funds

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are available for that purpose.

- d. Not later than 180 days after the initial meeting of the task 11 force, the task force shall issue a report to the Governor and, 12 pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the 13 Legislature, which shall include, but not be limited to  $^{2}[,]_{:}^{2}$  an 14 evaluation of <sup>2</sup>[the National Highway <sup>1</sup>[Transportation] Traffic<sup>1</sup> 15 Safety Administration's safety standards for advanced autonomous 16 vehicles and whether '[this] the State '[may] should enact 17 stricter safety standards, existing State laws that may unreasonably 18 impede the testing and operation of autonomous vehicles on public 19 roads in this State;<sup>2</sup> an evaluation of existing state and federal law 20 concerning advanced autonomous vehicles with a focus on <sup>2</sup>[safety 21 standards, licensing, registration, insurance, liability, law 22 enforcement and accident reporting, land use, road and 23 24 infrastructure design, public transit, and workforce changes; recommendations for implementing advanced autonomous vehicle 25 pilot programs to promote the safe testing and operation of 26 advanced autonomous vehicles on public roads in this State;<sup>2</sup> an 27 evaluation of existing legislation and regulations in other states 28 concerning advanced autonomous vehicles <sup>2</sup>[with a focus on safety 29 standards, 1;2 recommendations on how this State could safely 30 integrate advanced autonomous vehicles on its highways, streets, 31 and roads<sup>2</sup>[,];<sup>2</sup> any other information relevant to the subject of the 32 report<sup>2</sup>[,];<sup>2</sup> and any draft legislation the task force deems 33 appropriate to implement the purposes of P.L. 34 (pending before the Legislature as this bill)2, which shall be 35 consistent with federal law, regulations, and policy guidance<sup>2</sup>. 36
  - e. The task force shall be entitled to the assistance and services of the employees of any State board, bureau, commission, or agency as it may require, and as may be available to it for these purposes including, but not limited to, stenographic and clerical assistants within the limits of funds appropriated or otherwise made available to it for its purposes.
- f. The New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission <sup>2</sup> [and], <sup>2</sup> the
  Department of Transportation <sup>2</sup>, and the Alan M. Voorhees
  Transportation Center at Rutgers, the State University of New
  Jersey <sup>2</sup> shall assist the task force in the performance of its duties
