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**A JOINT RESOLUTION** designating the month of February each year as "Career and Technical Education Month" in New Jersey.

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4	WHEREAS, The month of February 2018 was celebrated nationally as
5	Career and Technical Education (CTE) Month; and
6	WHEREAS, Career and technical education programs in the 21st
7	century link rigorous academics, technical knowledge, real-world
8	experiences, and college-level learning to help students develop
9	career-ready skills and prepare them for post-secondary education
10	with a clear career focus; and
11	WHEREAS, New Jersey employers recognize that career and technical
12	education programs provide clear career pathways for students,
13	develop a strong pipeline of well-prepared future employees, and
14	ultimately strengthen the Garden State's economy; and
15	WHEREAS, More than 32,500 high school students and over 5,000
16	adults are enrolled in New Jersey's 21 county vocational-technical
17	school districts. These students benefit from a wide array of career
18	and technical education programs through which they gain valuable
19	preparation for college and the workforce, including industry-
20	recognized credentials, hands-on experience, and college credits;
