"Home care service employee" means a nurse, nurse aide, 17 homemaker-home health aide, ¹[or]¹ personal care assistant ¹, 18 19 physical therapist, occupational therapist, speech-language pathologist, or social worker¹ licensed or certified pursuant to ¹<u>Title</u> 20 26 or¹ Title 45 of the Revised Statutes or a hospice care worker 21 ¹employed by a hospice care program¹ licensed pursuant to section 22 2 of P.L.1997, c.78 (C.26:2H-80) who provides at home health or 23 24 personal care services.

b. The Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle 25 26 Commission shall issue upon application parking placards to home 27 care service agencies indicating that a motor vehicle is being 28 operated by a home care service employee. The placards shall be distributed by the home care service agencies to their home care 29 service employees who render health or personal care services. A 30 home care service agency applying for the placards shall submit to 31 the commission a copy of the agency's license or ³[other 32 credentials]³ issued by the Department of Health or ³registered with 33 the³ Division of Consumer Affairs in the Department of Law and 34 Public Safety. The commission shall take action within 30 days of 35 36 receiving the application.

The 27 28 commission may impose on each home care service agency a ³[onetime registration $]^3$ fee of $\frac{1}{\text{not more than}}$ $[50 \ 1]$ for less $]^1$ for each 29 parking placard ³[issued.
