AN ACT concerning the health education curriculum in public
schools and supplementing chapter 35 of Title 18A of the New
Jersey Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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8 1. a. A school district shall ensure that its health education 9 programs for students in grades kindergarten through 12 recognize the multiple dimensions of health by including mental health and 10 11 the relation of physical and mental health so as to enhance student 12 understanding, attitudes, and behaviors that promote health, well-13 being, and human dignity. The instruction in mental health shall be 14 adapted to the age and understanding of the students and shall be 15 incorporated as part of the district's implementation of the New Jersey Student Learning Standards in Comprehensive Health and 16 17 Physical Education. The instruction shall include, as appropriate, 18 information on substance abuse provided pursuant to the 19 implementation of these standards and to section 1 of P.L.2016, 20 c.46 (C.18A:40A-2.1).

21 b. The State Board of Education shall review and update the 22 New Jersey Student Learning Standards in Comprehensive Health 23 and Physical Education to ensure the incorporation of instruction in 24 mental health in an appropriate place in the curriculum for students in grades kindergarten through 12. In its review, the State board 25 26 shall consult with mental health experts including, but not limited 27 to, representatives from the Division of Mental Health and 28 Addiction Services in the Department of Human Services.

30 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall first apply to31 the 2020-2021 school year.

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Requires health curriculum for public school students in gradeskindergarten through 12 to include instruction on mental health.
