## P.L. 2019, CHAPTER 330, approved January 13, 2020 Assembly, No. 1576 (Second Reprint)

AN ACT concerning influenza vaccination <sup>2</sup>[of certain <sup>1</sup>[health care 1 workers] employees<sup>1</sup>]<sup>2</sup> and supplementing Title 26 of the Revised 2 3 Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey: 6 7 8 1. a. As used in this act: 9 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Health. "Health care facility" means a general or special hospital, 10 nursing home, or home health care agency licensed pursuant to 11 P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.). 12 <sup>1</sup>["Health care worker" means a person employed by a health 13 14 care facility who provides direct patient care or otherwise has 15 contact with patients.]<sup>1</sup> b. Commencing with the <sup>1</sup>[2013-2014] <sup>2</sup>[2018-2019<sup>1</sup>] onset of 16 the first<sup>2</sup> influenza season <sup>2</sup>next following the effective date of this 17 act<sup>2</sup>, each health care facility shall establish and implement an 18 annual influenza vaccination program in accordance with the 19 20 current recommendations of the Advisory Committee on 21 Immunization Practices of the federal Centers for Disease Control 22 and Prevention and any rules and regulations adopted by the commissioner pursuant to this act. 23 24 c. For the purposes of its annual influenza vaccination program, 25 each health care facility shall: (1) annually <sup>2</sup>[offer to]<sup>2</sup> provide an on-site or off-site influenza 26 vaccination to each of its <sup>1</sup>[health care workers] <u>employees</u><sup>1</sup>; 27 (2) require that each <sup>1</sup>[health care worker]  $\underline{employee}^{1}$  at the 28 facility receive an influenza vaccination <sup>1</sup>annually <sup>2</sup>[between 29 October 1 and], no later than<sup>2</sup> December 31 of the current 30 influenza season <sup>2</sup>[,<sup>1</sup>] as determined by the federal Centers for 31 Disease Control and Prevention, which vaccination shall be<sup>2</sup> 32 provided by the health care facility, except that <sup>1</sup>[a health care 33 worker] an employee<sup>1</sup> may, in lieu of receiving the influenza 34 vaccination at the facility, present acceptable proof, <sup>2</sup>[including] 35 36 comprising:  $(a)^2$  an attestation from the <sup>1</sup>[health care worker] <u>employee</u><sup>1</sup>, 37 <sup>2</sup>which shall be submitted in a form and manner designated by the 38 <u>facility</u>,<sup>2</sup> of a current influenza vaccination if the <sup>1</sup>[health care 39 worker] <u>employee</u><sup>1</sup> receives the vaccination from another 40

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vaccination source, <sup>2</sup>[or sign a written declination statement] which 1 attestation shall include the lot number of the vaccination the 2 3 employee received or; (b) a medical exemption, which shall be submitted using a form 4 5 designated by the Department of Health, stating that the influenza vaccination for that employee is medically contraindicated, as 6 7 enumerated by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices 8 of the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. An 9 attestation of a medical exemption shall be subject to approval by 10 the facility following a review by the facility to confirm the medical 11 exemption is consistent with standards enumerated by the Advisory 12 <u>Committee on Immunization Practices</u><sup>2</sup>; (3) maintain a record or attestation, as applicable, of influenza 13 vaccinations  ${}^{2}$  and medical exemptions  ${}^{2}$  for each  ${}^{2}$ [1] the lefth care 14 worker] <u>employee</u><sup>1</sup>, retain each signed declination statement from 15 <sup>1</sup>[a health care worker] <u>an</u>]<sup>2</sup> <u>employee</u><sup>1</sup> <sup>2</sup>[who elects not to receive 16 an influenza vaccination,  $]^2$  and report to the Department of Health, 17 18 in a manner and according to a schedule prescribed by the commissioner, the vaccination percentage rate of its <sup>1</sup>[health care]<sup>1</sup> 19 workforce in receiving influenza vaccinations as part of the 20 21 facility's annual vaccination program or by other means as attested to by the <sup>1</sup>[health care]<sup>1</sup> workforce, as applicable. The report may 22 23 also include other information that the facility deems relevant to its 24 vaccination percentage rate, including, but not limited to, the number of <sup>1</sup>[health care workers] <u>employees</u><sup>1</sup> who <sup>2</sup>[signed 25 declination statements that the facility has]<sup>2</sup> received <sup>2</sup>medical 26 exemptions<sup>2</sup>; 27 (4) provide an educational component to its program that is 28 29 designed to inform <sup>1</sup>[health care workers] <u>employees</u><sup>1</sup> about: influenza vaccination; non-vaccine influenza control measures; and 30 the symptoms, transmission, and potential impact of influenza;<sup>2</sup> 31 32 and **1**<sup>2</sup> 33 (5) annually conduct an evaluation of the program with the goal of improving the rate of vaccination among its <sup>1</sup>[health care 34 workers] employees<sup>1 2</sup>; and 35 36 (6) require any employee who does not receive an influenza 37 vaccination to wear a surgical or procedural mask when in direct 38 contact with patients and in common areas, as specified in facility 39 policy, or to be removed from direct patient care responsibilities 40 during influenza season<sup>2</sup>. d. A health care facility may suspend its annual <sup>2</sup>[offer of ]<sup>2</sup> 41 influenza vaccination <sup>2</sup>program<sup>2</sup> pursuant to this act in the event of 42 43 a shortage of influenza vaccine as determined by the commissioner. 44 e. (1) <sup>1</sup>[Any] <u>The commissioner may assess such penalties and</u> 45 take other actions against a health care facility, as provided in P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.), or any rules and regulations 46

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adopted pursuant thereto, for any<sup>1</sup> determination by the 1 commissioner of noncompliance by a health care facility or any of 2 its '[health care workers]  $\underline{employees}^1$  with the provisions of this 3 act<sup>1</sup>[, based upon an inspection or survey conducted by the 4 5 Department of Health pursuant to section 5 of P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-5), or as otherwise determined by the commissioner, shall 6 7 not constitute a licensure violation or deficiency with respect to that 8 facility for the purposes of P.L.1971, c.136 (C.26:2H-1 et seq.), or 9 any rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto  $\mathbf{J}^1$ . (2) The commissioner shall seek to minimize any record-keeping 10 burden imposed on a health care facility pursuant to this act and 11 12 shall take such actions as are necessary to ensure the confidentiality 13 of any data furnished to the department pursuant to this act that may contain information identifying an individual <sup>1</sup>[health care worker] 14 15 employee<sup>1</sup>. (3) The commissioner shall make available to the public 16 17 aggregate data reported by a facility pursuant to paragraph (3) of 18 subsection c. of this section. 19 f. A health care facility shall not discharge or reduce the pay of <sup>2</sup>[a health care worker] <u>an employee</u><sup>2</sup> who <sup>2</sup>[declines to receive 20 an] receives a medical exemption from the annual<sup>2</sup> influenza 21 vaccination <sup>2</sup>requirement<sup>2</sup>. 22 g. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a health 23 24 care facility from <sup>2</sup> [taking measures to protect its patients in the event that <sup>1</sup>[a health care workers] an employee<sup>1</sup> declines to 25 receive an influenza vaccination, which measures may include, but 26 are not limited to, relocation or change of assignment of <sup>1</sup>[a health 27 care workers] an employee<sup>1</sup>] adopting additional policies and 28 29 procedures with regard to the annual influenza vaccine that are not inconsistent with the requirements of this section<sup>2</sup>. 30 31 32 2. No later than August 1st of each year, the commissioner 33 shall report to the Governor, and to the Legislature pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), on the vaccination 34 35 percentage rates of health care workers for the prior influenza 36 season. 37 38 3. The Commissioner of Health, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et 39 40 seq.), shall adopt rules and regulations as necessary to implement 41 the provisions of this act. 42 43 4. This act shall take effect immediately. 44 45 46 Requires certain health care facilities to provide, and employees 47 to receive, annual influenza vaccination.
