WHEREAS, The "Older Americans Act of 1965" (Pub.L. 89-73)
(OAA) was enacted in response to Congressional concerns about the lack of community-based social services for senior citizens around the nation; and
WHEREAS, The OAA gave states authority over grants for community

WHEREAS, The OAA gave states authority over grants for community
 planning, social services, research and development projects for the
 elderly, and personnel training on aging-related issues; and

WHEREAS, The OAA also established the Administration on Aging in the Department of Health and Human Services as the federal agency responsible for administering the grants for legal, nutritional, supportive home, community-based social, disease prevention, and health promotion services and programs for the prevention of elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation; and

WHEREAS, In June of 2012, S.3358, the "Responding to Urgent Needs
of Survivors of the Holocaust Act" (RUSH Act), was introduced to
amend the OAA to ensure that the approximately 127,000 aging
Holocaust survivors currently living in the United States can access
health care, nutrition, transportation, and community-based support
services to enable them to age in place; and

WHEREAS, Many Holocaust survivors who emigrated to the United
 States live in poverty and represent an extremely vulnerable at-risk
 population, more reliant on social services programs than most
 other older Americans, with a disproportionate number needing
 services such as personal care, home-delivered and congregate
 meals, transportation, and mental health support; and

WHEREAS, The RUSH Act addresses the unique challenges facing
aging Holocaust survivors residing both at home and in community
based long-term care facilities by ensuring that their religious,
cultural, and ethnic needs are met and allowing Holocaust survivors
to age with dignity, comfort, and security; and

WHEREAS, The RUSH Act includes Holocaust survivors on the list of
older Americans receiving preference for services under the OAA;
authorizes the Administration on Aging, through its Community
Living Program, to implement services specifically for aging
Holocaust survivors; and establishes a grant program to provide
money to nonprofit organizations to create, improve, and expand
transportation services for the survivors; and

42 WHEREAS, The RUSH Act also authorizes the OAA's Nutrition 43 Program to ensure that home-delivered nutrition services meet the 44 special health related and nutritional needs of program participants 45 with religious, cultural, or ethnic dietary food restrictions and to 46 encourage employees of these programs to observe homebound 47 senior citizens and recognize the warning signs of medical
