1 AN ACT concerning forfeiture and amending N.J.S.2C:64-1.

3 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
4 of New Jersey:

5

6 1. (New section) The Legislature hereby finds and declares:

7 a. The illegal possession and transportation of firearms within
8 the State of New Jersey poses a serious threat to the health, safety
9 and welfare of the citizens of this State;

10 b. The illegal possession and transportation of firearms in
11 vehicles poses an enhanced risk to the citizens of this State by
12 facilitating the criminal use of the firearms on public roadways and
13 by enabling the spread of firearms within this State;

14 c. An unlawfully-possessed firearm found in a vehicle almost
15 always has either been or is intended to be transported in the
16 vehicle; and

17 d. It is the public policy of this State to aggressively fight the
18 illegal possession and transportation of unlawfully-possessed
19 firearms through forfeiture of the vehicle.

21 2. N.J.S.2C:64-1 is amended to read as follows:

22 2C:64-1. Property Subject to Forfeiture.

23 a. Any interest in the following shall be subject to forfeiture
24 and no property right shall exist in them:

25 (1) Controlled dangerous substances, firearms which are
26 unlawfully possessed, carried, acquired or used, illegally possessed
27 gambling devices, untaxed cigarettes, untaxed special fuel, unlawful
28 sound recordings and audiovisual works and items bearing a
29 counterfeit mark. These shall be designated prima facie contraband.

30 (2) All property which has been, or is intended to be, utilized in
31 furtherance of an unlawful activity, including, but not limited to,
32 conveyances intended to facilitate the perpetration of illegal acts, or
33 buildings or premises maintained for the purpose of committing
34 offenses against the State.

35 (3) Property which has become or is intended to become an
36 integral part of illegal activity, including, but not limited to, money
37 which is earmarked for use as financing for an illegal gambling
38 enterprise.

39 (4) Proceeds of illegal activities, including, but not limited to,
40 property or money obtained as a result of the sale of prima facie
41 contraband as defined by subsection a. (1), proceeds of illegal
42 gambling, prostitution, bribery and extortion.

43 (5) A motor vehicle in which a violation of subsection a., b., c.
44 or f. of N.J.S.2C:39-5 was committed.
