1 AN ACT concerning the New Jersey State Board of Dentistry,
2 amending R.S.45:6-1 and repealing section 10 of P.L.2007,
3 c.259.

5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
6 of New Jersey:

8 1. R.S.45:6-1 is amended as follows:

9 45:6-1. The State Board of Registration and Examination in
10 Dentistry in the Division of Professional Boards of the Department
11 of Law and Public Safety, hereinafter in this chapter designated as
12 the "board," created and established by an act entitled "An act to
13 regulate the practice of dentistry in the State of New Jersey, and to
14 repeal certain acts now relating to the same," approved March 31,
15 1915 (L.1915, c. 146, p. 261), as amended and supplemented, is
16 continued, and shall hereafter be known and designated as the New
17 Jersey State Board of Dentistry. Wherever in any law, rule,
18 regulation, judicial or administrative proceeding or otherwise,
19 reference is made to the State Board of Registration and
20 Examination in Dentistry, the same shall mean and refer to the New
21 Jersey State Board of Dentistry.

22 In addition to two public members, the board shall consist of
23 **[nine]** eleven members, **[eight]** nine of whom shall have resided
24 and practiced dentistry in this State for at least 10 years each
25 immediately preceding their appointments **[and]**, one of whom
26 shall be a dental hygienist, and one of whom shall be a dental
27 assistant appointed by the Governor for a term of 4 years. In
28 appointing **[such]** a dental hygienist and dental assistant, the
29 Governor shall give due consideration to, but shall not be bound by,
30 the recommendation of the New Jersey Dental **[Hygienists]**
31 Hygienists' Association and the New Jersey Dental Assistants'
32 Association, as applicable. Upon the expiration of the term of
33 office of any member, his successor shall be appointed by the
34 Governor, subject to the provisions of **[section 45:1-2 of this Title,**
35 for a term of 4 years, except that the successors of the members
36 whose terms will expire on June 4, 1949, shall be appointed each
37 for a term expiring on August 31, 1952; the successors of the
38 members whose terms will expire on November 9, 1949, and
39 January 7, 1950, respectively, shall be appointed each for a term
40 expiring on August 31, 1953; the successors of the members
41 whose terms will expire on July 31, 1950, and October 8, 1950,
42 respectively, shall be appointed each for a term expiring on August
43 31, 1954; and the successors of the members whose terms will
44 expire on July 30, 1951, and November 4, 1951, respectively, shall

1 be appointed each for a term expiring on August 31, 1955】
2 P.L.1971, c.60 (C.45:1-2.1 et seq.). Each member shall hold his
3 office until his successor is appointed and qualifies. Any vacancy
4 in the membership of the board, occurring from any cause, shall be
5 filled by the Governor for the unexpired term only. Upon cause
6 being shown before him, the Governor may remove a member from
7 office upon proven charges of inefficiency, incompetency,
8 immorality or professional misconduct.
