#### SYNOPSIS

Permits establishment by county and four-year institutions of higher education of three plus one degree programs for receipt of baccalaureate degree after spending three years at county college and one year at senior institution.

#### **S869** [1R] SWEENEY, CUNNINGHAM

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AN ACT concerning the establishment of three plus one degree 1 2 programs at institutions of higher education and supplementing 3 Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. a. A four-year institution of higher education and a county 9 college may partner to establish a three plus one degree program for 10 a baccalaureate degree in such majors as the institutions of higher 11 education may determine. 12 b. Under a three plus one degree program established pursuant 13 to this section, a student admitted into the program shall: 14 (1) complete the first two academic years of the program at the 15 county college, pay the tuition and fees of the county college, and 16 receive an associate degree; 17 (2) complete the third academic year of the program at the 18 county college and pay the tuition and fees of the county college. 19 Academic credits for the third academic year shall be awarded by 20 the county college. Instruction in the third academic year in any 300-level class shall be provided by either an advanced degree 21 22 faculty member of the county college in collaboration with a faculty 23 member of the four-year institution or by a faculty member of the 24 four-year institution, in accordance with accreditation standards of 25 the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. Instruction in 26 the third academic year in any 300-level class shall be equivalent in 27 rigor to instruction in 300-level classes taught at the four-year institution <sup>1</sup>. To maintain academic quality control, in the third year, 28 29 the course content of courses in the student's major shall be 30 determined by the four-year institution with input from the county college faculty<sup>1</sup>; 31 32 (3) be admitted to and attend the four-year institution for the 33 fourth academic year of the program and pay the tuition and fees of 34 that institution: and (4) earn a baccalaureate degree from the four-year institution. 35 36 c. The Secretary of Higher Education shall report annually to 37 the Governor, and to the Legislature pursuant to section 2 of 38 P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), on the number of three plus one 39 degree programs implemented during the prior academic year. 40 d. Any three plus one degree program for a baccalaureate 41 degree in a particular major which was established prior to the effective date of this act or approved by the governing boards of the 42 43 institutions prior to the effective date of this act shall be exempt 44 from the provisions of this section.

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2. a. Notwithstanding any law or regulation to the contrary, a 1 2 student who is otherwise eligible for a State tuition aid grant and 3 who is participating in a three plus one degree program established 4 pursuant to section 1 of P.L., c. (C. ) (pending before the 5 Legislature as this bill) shall be eligible for a State tuition aid grant while enrolled in a county college for the third academic year of the 6 7 program.

8 b. Notwithstanding any law or regulation to the contrary, a 9 student who is otherwise eligible for an Educational Opportunity 10 Fund grant and who is participating in a three plus one degree program established pursuant to section 1 of P.L., c. 11 (C. ) 12 (pending before the Legislature as this bill) shall be eligible for an 13 Educational Opportunity Fund grant while enrolled in a county 14 college for the third academic year of the program.

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3. Notwithstanding any law or regulation to the contrary, a
student participating in a three plus one degree program established
pursuant to section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the
Legislature as this bill):

a. shall be eligible to receive an NJSTARS scholarship for the first <sup>1</sup>[two] <u>three</u><sup>1</sup> academic years of the three plus one degree program, provided the student meets the requirements for receipt of the scholarship; and

b. shall be eligible to receive an NJSTARS II scholarship for the <sup>1</sup>[third and]<sup>1</sup> fourth academic <sup>1</sup>[years] <u>year</u><sup>1</sup> of the three plus one degree program, provided the student meets the requirements for receipt of the scholarship. <sup>1</sup>[For the third academic year the scholarship shall be in an amount that covers the full cost of tuition at the county college.]<sup>1</sup>

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31 4. This act shall take effect in the first full academic year32 following the date of enactment.
