seq.). The instruction shall take place as part of the district's
implementation of the New Jersey Student Learning Standards in
Comprehensive Health and Physical Education.

## STATEMENT

This bill requires each board of education which operates an 22 23 educational program for public school students in grades 9 through 24 12 to provide information on the provisions of the "New Jersey Safe 25 Haven Infant Protection Act," P.L.2000, c.58. The bill specifies that the instruction will take place as part of the district's 26 27 implementation of the New Jersey Student Learning Standards in 28 Comprehensive Health and Physical Education beginning with the 29 2018-2019 school year.

Newborn infants are sometimes abandoned in life-threatening situations by parents under severe emotional stress. At times these parents are teens who are frightened and overwhelmed with dealing with an unanticipated pregnancy. Fostering awareness of the availability of a "safe haven" provided under the law may ultimately help to protect the life of a newborn.
