Requires display of identifying information on rear of school bus so public may report bus driver misconduct.

4	BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5	of New Jersey:

7	1. Section 2 of P.L.1965, c.119 (C.39:3B-2) is amended to read
8	as follows:
9	1. <u>a.</u> There shall be displayed on every bus subject to the
10	provisions of section 1 of [this act] P.L.1965, c.119 (C.39:3B-1)
11	signs or legends which will, insofar as practicable, inform the driver
12	of any vehicle concerning the duty imposed upon him by law with
13	respect to passing [such] a bus, while it is loading or unloading.
14	[Such] The signs or legends shall be in [such] a color, form, and
15	design as will meet the requirements prescribed by the State Board
16	of Education, which requirements shall not be inconsistent with the
17	provisions of this Title or any rule or regulation made pursuant
18 19	thereto.  b. An agency, board of education, nonpublic school, or school
20	bus contractor operating a school bus subject to the provisions of
21	section 1 of P.L.1965, c.119 (C.39:3B-1) shall display across the
22	rear of the school bus a telephone number, website address, or other
23	identifying information <sup>1</sup> [that allows] which shall allow the public
24	to report a bus driver's misconduct while operating the school bus
25	<sup>1</sup> to the board of education or nonpublic school for which the school
26	bus provides transportation <sup>1</sup> . The lettering shall be of a color that
27	contrasts with the color of the school bus.

30	<sup>1</sup> 2. (New section) The Commissioner of Education, in
31	consultation with the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor
32	Vehicle Commission and the Superintendent of the Division of State
33	Police in the Department of Law and Public Safety, shall promulgate
34	regulations pursuant to the "Administrative Procedures Act,"
35	P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.) to effectuate the provisions of
36	P.L. c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).
37	The regulations shall establish:
38	(1) the appropriate board of education or nonpublic school official
39	or designee to address and respond to a complaint of school bus driver
40	misconduct;
41	(2) the appropriate actions which a board of education or nonpublic
42	school may take to respond to a complaint of school bus driver
43	misconduct; and
