

SYNOPSIS

Requires Adjutant General of DMVA to issue State flag to resident enrolling in federal service academy.

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AN ACT concerning New Jersey residents who enroll in a federal 1 2 service academy, and amending N.J.S.38A:3-6. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. N.J.S.38A:3-6 is amended to read as follows: 38A:3-6. Under the direction of the Governor, the Adjutant 8 9 General shall: 10 (a) Exercise control over the affairs of the Department of 11 Military and Veterans' Affairs and in connection therewith make 12 and issue such regulations governing the work of the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs and the conduct of its employees as 13 14 may, in his judgment, be necessary or desirable. 15 (b) Be the request officer of the Department of Military and 16 Veterans' Affairs within the meaning of such term as defined in 17 section 1 of P.L.1944, c.112 (C.52:27B-1). 18 (c) (Deleted by amendment, P.L.1988, c.138.) (d) Command the organized militia of the State, with 19 20 responsibility for recruiting, mobilization, administration, training, discipline, equipping, supply and general efficiency thereof. He 21 22 may issue such regulations and delegate such command functions as 23 he shall deem necessary. The regulations so issued shall, insofar as 24 possible, conform to the federal laws and regulations concerning the 25 same. 26 (e) Maintain the archives and be the custodian of the records 27 and papers required, by laws or regulations, to be filed with the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs. 28 29 (f) Supervise, administer and coordinate those activities of the 30 selective service system for which the Governor is responsible. 31 (g) Acquire by gift, grant, purchase, exchange, eminent domain, 32 or in any other lawful manner, in the name of and for the use of the 33 State of New Jersey, all those parcels of land as shall be necessary 34 for armories and other militia facilities, and supervise the design, 35 construction, alteration, maintenance and repair of said property. (h) Establish and maintain such headquarters as may be required 36 37 for the militia. 38 (i) Exercise the powers vested in him and perform such other 39 duties and functions as required of him by the Governor and by 40 federal and State laws and regulations. 41 (j) Exercise all of the functions, powers and duties heretofore 42 vested in the Director of the Division on Veterans' Programs and 43 Special Services. 44 (k) Appoint and remove officers and other personnel employed 45 within the department, subject to the provisions of N.J.S.38A:3-8 EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter underlined thus is new matter.

1 and Title 11A of the New Jersey Statutes and other applicable 2 statutes, except as herein otherwise specifically provided.

3 (1) Have authority to organize and maintain an administrative 4 division and to assign to employment therein secretarial, clerical 5 and other assistants in the department or the Adjutant General's Office for the purpose of providing centralized support to all 6 7 segments of the department, including budgeting, personnel 8 administration and oversight of equal opportunity programs.

9 (m) Perform, exercise and discharge the functions, powers and 10 duties of the department through such divisions as may be 11 established by this act or otherwise by law.

12 (n) Organize the work of the department in divisions not 13 inconsistent with the provisions of this act and in bureaus and other organizational units as the Adjutant General may determine to be 14 15 necessary for efficient and effective operation.

16 (o) Adopt, issue and promulgate, in the name of the department, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 17 18 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), such rules and regulations as may be 19 authorized by law.

20 (p) Institute, or cause to be instituted, legal proceedings or 21 processes as necessary to properly enforce and give effect to any of 22 the Adjutant General's powers or duties.

23 (q) Make an annual report to the Governor and to the 24 Legislature of the department's operations, and render other reports 25 as the Governor shall from time to time request or as may be required by law. 26

27 (r) Coordinate the activities of the department, and the several 28 divisions and other agencies therein, in a manner designed to 29 eliminate overlapping and duplicative functions.

30 (s) Integrate within the department, so far as practicable, all 31 staff services of the department and of several divisions and other agencies therein. 32

33 (t) Request access to all relevant files and records of other State 34 agencies, which may be made available to the Adjutant General by 35 the head of a State agency, and request, subject to the permission of the head of the State agency, any officer or employee therein to 36 37 provide information as necessary to assist in the performance of the 38 functions of the department.

39 (u) Supervise and operate the New Jersey Veterans' Memorial 40 Home-Menlo Park, the New Jersey Veterans' Memorial Home-41 Vineland, the New Jersey Veterans' Memorial Home-Paramus and 42 the New Jersey Veterans' Memorial Cemetery-Arneytown.

43 (v) Supervise and operate the liaison office and the field offices 44 which serve the federal Veterans' Affairs Medical Centers.

45 (w) Make application for federal grants and programs, other than 46 education grants or funds.

(x) Administer the federally-funded training and rehabilitation
 programs, except for the administration of federally-funded
 education and training programs set forth in 38 U.S.C. s.36 et seq.

(y) Provide current information to the general public on State
and federal veterans' programs and benefits; create a comprehensive
public webpage for women veterans that includes, but is not limited
to, the following information: veterans' legal rights, benefits,
medical and insurance issues, education, the transition from active
service to civilian life, and other resources available to veterans.

(z) Develop and administer the New Jersey Homeless Veterans
Grant Program established pursuant to section 3 of P.L.2013, c.239
(C.38A:3-6.2b).

13 (aa) Encourage and facilitate the registration of each service 14 member residing in New Jersey with the United States Department 15 of Veterans Affairs, or its successor agency. Registration shall take 16 place, as appropriate, when the service member returns from 17 deployment on federal active duty or is discharged or as soon as 18 possible thereafter. The term "service member" shall mean 19 members of the New Jersey National Guard and members of the 20 United States Armed Forces, or a Reserve component thereof, when 21 the information on each member is made available to the 22 department.

23 (bb) Develop and coordinate a volunteer-based program 24 comprised of former servicemembers to assist and mentor veterans 25 who become involved with the criminal justice system, while 26 criminal proceedings are pending and afterward, in accessing 27 assistance to resolve the underlying problems that led or contributed 28 to the veteran's involvement with the criminal justice system 29 including, but not limited to, offering support and guidance, 30 securing housing, employment linkages, job training, education, 31 transportation, disability compensation claims, discharge status, 32 health care and other linkages available at the local. State and 33 federal level that can ease the challenge of reentry into civilian life. 34 In addition, the Adjutant General shall develop a registry of 35 volunteer mentors and make the registry available pursuant to 36 P.L.2017, c.42 (C.2C:43-23 et al.).

37 (cc) Prepare and disseminate a directory of Veterans Diversion
38 Resource Program entities currently available within New Jersey
39 pursuant to P.L.2017, c.42 (C.2C:43-23 et al.).

40 (dd) Create a comprehensive public webpage for Gold Star 41 family members that includes, but is not limited to, the following 42 information: State benefits; State and county liaisons; a list of 43 service members from New Jersey killed in action; links to other 44 Gold Star family organizations; and such other information and 45 resources as the Adjutant General deems necessary and beneficial to 46 a Gold Star family member. A "Gold Star family member" means 47 the spouse, domestic partner, partner in a civil union, parent,

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1 brother, sister, child, legal guardian, or other legal custodian, 2 whether of the whole or half blood, or by adoption. 3 (ee) Identify each New Jersey resident who enrolls in the United States Military Academy, United States Naval Academy, United 4 States Coast Guard Academy, United States Merchant Marine 5 6 Academy, or United States Air Force Academy, and issue a New 7 Jersey State flag to that individual. 8 (cf: P.L.2017, c.58, s.1) 9 10 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 11 12 **STATEMENT** 13 14 15 This bill requires the Adjutant General to identify each New 16 Jersey resident who enrolls in the United States Military Academy, 17 United States Naval Academy, United States Coast Guard Academy, United States Merchant Marine Academy, or United 18 19 States Air Force Academy, and issue a New Jersey State flag to that 20 individual. This bill honors each resident of New Jersey who enrolls in a 21 federal service academy for that individual's commitment to the 22 23 defense of New Jersey and the United States of America. These 24 distinguished New Jersey residents have dedicated themselves to a 25 life of military service, and have each demonstrated superior 26 academic ability and integrity.
