Authorizes electric and gas public utility assistance grants funded from societal benefits charge revenue for qualified households.

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1 AN ACT concerning societal benefits charge revenues and providing 2 for certain energy assistance grants. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary of section 12 of P.L.1999, c.23 (C.48:3-60) or any law, rule, regulation, or 8 9 order adopted pursuant thereto, in the fiscal year commencing July 10 1, 2018, the Board of Public Utilities shall, from available balances 11 accumulated in accounts of the board from funds collected through 12 the societal benefits charge imposed pursuant to that section, 13 allocate \$25,000,000 to fund the issuance of grants to help pay the electric and gas public utility bills of households seeking temporary 14 15 assistance from a Statewide nonprofit energy assistance 16 organization with: 17 (1) a network of no less than 200 partner organizations throughout all 21 counties in this State, providing secure, online, or 18 19 in-person grant application access; 20 (2) a board of directors comprised of not less than five electric 21 or gas public utility representatives; and 22 (3) an on-site customer service call center providing access to 23 assistance offered in a minimum of 150 languages, as designated by 24 the board. 25 b. Within one year after the board has completed the 26 disbursement of grant monies to a Statewide nonprofit energy 27 assistance organization as required under this section, the Statewide nonprofit energy assistance organization shall issue a report to the 28 29 board which shall provide: 30 (1) the number of applicants applying for household electric and 31 gas public utility assistance grants; (2) the number of households receiving electric and gas public 32 33 utility assistance grants; 34 (3) the average amount of assistance provided; 35 (4) the average gross income of households receiving assistance; (5) the methods and procedures used for the verification of 36 37 income or hardship; and 38 (6) any other information as required by the board. 39 c. The board shall thereupon submit the report to the Governor 40 and, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the 41 Legislature. 42 43 2. This act shall take effect on July 1, 2018 and shall expire on 44 the 30th day following submission to the Governor and the 45 Legislature of the report required to be issued pursuant to section 1 46 of this act.

STATEMENT

3 This bill provides that beginning with the State fiscal year 4 starting on July 1, 2018, the Board of Public Utilities (board) is to 5 dedicate \$25 million from available balances collected through the societal benefits charge, to provide grants to help pay the electric 6 7 and gas public utility (utility) bills of households seeking temporary 8 assistance from a Statewide nonprofit energy assistance 9 organization with a network of no less than 200 partner 10 organizations throughout all 21 counties in this State, providing 11 secure, online or in-person grant application access, with a board of 12 directors comprised of not less than five utility representatives, with 13 an on-site customer service call center providing access to 14 assistance offered in a minimum of 150 languages, as designated by 15 the board.

16 Within one year after the board completes the disbursement of grant monies to the Statewide nonprofit energy assistance 17 18 organization, the organization is to issue a report to the board 19 providing the number of applicants applying for household utility 20 assistance grants, the number of households receiving utility 21 assistance grants, the average amount of assistance provided, the 22 average gross income of households receiving assistance, the 23 methods and procedures used for the verification of income or 24 hardship, and any other information the board requires.

25 The provisions of this bill are to expire upon the 30th day after the submission of the report to the Governor and the Legislature. 26

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
