4	BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5	of New Jersey:

7	1. N.J.S.2C:33-9 is amended to reads as follows:
8	2C:33-9. Desecration of Venerated Objects. A person commits a
9	disorderly persons offense if he purposely desecrates any public
10	monument, insignia, symbol, or structure, or place of worship or
11	burial.
12	A person commits a crime of the third degree if he purposely
13	desecrates a military monument.
14	"Desecrate" means defacing, damaging or polluting.
15	"Military monument" means any monument that was erected
16	with the intent to honor a current or former member or members of
17	the armed forces or to mark or commemorate a past military action
18	or battle.

21	2. This act shall take effect immediately.

24	STATEMENT
25	
26	This bill makes purposely desecrating a military monument a
27	crime of the third degree. As used in the bill, the term "military
28	monument" means any monument that was erected with the intent
29	to honor a current or former member or members of the armed
