SYNOPSIS

Mandates child abuse and sexual abuse training for all candidates for teaching certification.

S2711 [2R] RUIZ, MADDEN

1 AN ACT concerning certain training for prospective teachers and 2 supplementing chapter 26 of Title 18A of the New Jersey 3 Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, all candidates for teaching certification who have completed a ²[teacher] certificate of eligibility with advanced standing educator² preparation program ²[at a regionally-accredited institution of higher education] approved by the commissioner² shall have satisfactorily completed a ²[program on] course or training that includes² the recognition of, and the requirement to report, child abuse including sexual abuse.
 - b. Beginning with the ²[2019-2020] <u>2020-2021</u>² school year, any person seeking certification through the alternate route shall, within one year of being employed, satisfactorily complete a ²[program on] <u>course or training that includes</u>² the recognition of, and the requirement to report, child abuse including sexual abuse ²through a certificate of eligibility educator preparation program ².
 - c. ²[The State Board of Education ¹, in consultation with the Commissioner of Children and Families, ¹ shall establish the appropriate requirements of the program on the recognition and reporting of child abuse required pursuant to this section All commissioner-approved educator preparation programs shall be reviewed and revised to implement the requirements of this section, and the revision shall be submitted to the commissioner for approval².

2. This act shall take effect immediately.
