Requires institutions of higher education to offer cats and dogs no longer used for educational, research, or scientific purposes for adoption; designated the "Homes for Animal Heroes Act."

- 1. a. An institution of higher education ¹[, or a facility that 9 conducts research in collaboration with an institution of higher 10 11 education, 1 that uses cats or dogs for educational, research, or scientific purposes ¹[, before euthanizing a cat or dog that is no 12 longer to be used for such purposes,] 2, or a research institution that 13 contracts with an institution of higher education for the use of cats 14 or dogs for educational, research, or scientific purposes, 2 shall 15 ²[assess] require the assessment of the health of ² a cat or dog and 16 determine whether it is suitable for adoption ²[, when the cat or dog 17 is no longer needed for educational, research, or scientific 18 purposes after the completion of any testing or research involving 19 the cat or dog². If the institution ²[of higher education]² 20 determines that the cat or dog is suitable for adoption, the 21 institution ²[of higher education¹]² shall ¹[first]¹ offer the cat or 22 dog to an animal rescue organization 1 or private individual 1 for 23 adoption ¹[, provided that euthanizing the cat or dog is not required 24 for health or safety reasons 1. An institution [or facility]1 25 required to offer cats or dogs ¹[to an animal rescue organization] 26 for adoption¹ pursuant to this section may enter into an agreement 27 with an animal rescue organization or private individual to 28 implement this section on an on-going basis. 29
 - b. An institution ¹ [or facility] ¹ that provides a cat or dog to an animal rescue organization ¹ or private individual ¹ pursuant to this section shall be immune from any civil liability arising from the transfer of the cat or dog, provided the institution ¹ [or facility] ¹ has acted in good faith concerning the ¹ [health and physical condition of] suitability of ¹ the cat or dog ¹ for adoption ¹.
 - ¹c. An institution ²[of higher education]² required to offer cats or dogs for adoption pursuant to this section may establish guidelines or other qualifications in order to determine if a cat or dog is suitable for adoption, or to determine whether an animal rescue organization or private individual is qualified to receive a cat or dog for adoption pursuant to this section.¹
