#### **SYNOPSIS**

Establishes local drug overdose fatality review teams in each county in State.

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As amended by the Senate on December 16, 2019.

1 AN ACT regarding drug overdoses and supplementing Title 26 of the Revised Statutes.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. a. The <sup>2</sup>[Commissioner of Health] <u>Local Advisory</u> 7 Committee on Alcohol Use Disorder and Substance Use Disorder in 8 each county<sup>2</sup> <sup>3</sup> [shall] may<sup>3</sup> establish a local drug overdose fatality 9 review team for <sup>2</sup>[each] that <sup>2</sup> county <sup>2</sup>[in this State] <sup>2</sup>. A local 10 drug overdose fatality review team may <sup>2</sup>[be assigned to] serve<sup>2</sup> 11 one or more counties where practicable. Each local drug overdose 12 fatality review team shall elect a <sup>1</sup>[chairman] chair <sup>1</sup> <sup>3</sup>[to administer 13 a process of review and enact and implement a standard protocol for 14 the collection and maintenance of data that shall be consistent with 15 all teams. <sup>2</sup>The Commissioner of Human Services shall make 16 available to local drug overdose fatality review teams such funding 17 18 as may be appropriate to enable the teams to undertake the duties 19 required under this section, which may include, but shall not be limited to, funding sufficient to allow each team to employ 20 21 appropriate full-time and part-time personnel as may be necessary ]<sup>3</sup>.2 22
  - b. Local drug overdose fatality review teams shall consist of individuals with experience and knowledge regarding health, social services, law enforcement, education, emergency medicine, mental health, juvenile delinquency, and drug and alcohol abuse.
  - <sup>1</sup>[All participants shall disclose to the commissioner all related records of a deceased individual, whose death has been determined to be the result of a drug overdose, including information and records related to physical health, mental health, and treatment for substance abuse that are maintained by a health care provider, and provide access to information and records maintained by a State or local government agency, including death certificates, law enforcement information, medical examiner information, parole and probation information, social service information and educational information. The commissioner shall transfer the records to the local drug overdose fatality review team assigned to the county in which the individual's death occurred The <sup>2</sup>[commissioner] Commissioner of Health<sup>2</sup> shall develop a mandatory drug overdose death reporting process, pursuant to which health care practitioners, medical examiners, hospitals, emergency medical services providers, local health departments, law enforcement agencies, substance use disorder treatment programs, and relevant social services agencies will be required to confidentially report <sup>2</sup>cases of drug overdose death<sup>2</sup> to the

- 1 Department of Health <sup>2</sup>[on individual cases of drug overdose death in a standardized, uniform format<sup>2</sup>. 2
- d. The department shall <sup>2</sup> [maintain a record of all reports of 3 drug overdose death that are submitted thereto through the reporting 4 5 processes that are established pursuant to subsection c. of this section. The reports shall contain transmit to the appropriate local 6 drug overdose fatality review team such information as the 7 department has available concerning any drug overdose that occurs 8 9 within the county served by the local drug overdose fatality review 10 team, including, but not limited to: the individual's age, race,
- 11 gender, county of residence, and county of death; and the date,
- 12 manner, cause, and specific circumstances of the overdose death, as
- 13 recorded on the individual's completed death certificate. In
- 14 addition, the team may be provided access to the following<sup>2</sup> records
- related to <sup>2</sup>[a deceased] the <sup>2</sup> individual <sup>2</sup>[, whose death has been 15
- determined to be the result of a drug overdose, including, but not 16
- limited to ]2: 17
- (1) <sup>2</sup>[the individual's age, race, gender, county of residence, and 18 county of death; 19
- (2) the date, manner, cause, and specific circumstances of the 20 21 overdose death;
- (3) **1** any relevant information and records maintained by a 22 health care provider related to the individual's physical health, 23 24 mental health, and substance use disorder treatment <sup>3</sup>[, <sup>2</sup>[if applicable, ]2 if the individual's next of kin or authorized 25 representative <sup>2</sup>[;]<sup>2</sup> consents to the release of the information or 26
- records ]3; and 2[; 27

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- (4) (2)<sup>2</sup> any relevant information and records maintained by a 28 State or local government agency, including <sup>2</sup> [death certificate, law 29 enforcement, records, including 2 criminal 2 histories history 30 records<sup>2</sup> and records of probation and parole <sup>3</sup> if the transmission of 31 such records does not imperil ongoing investigations<sup>3</sup>, medical 32 examiner records, social service records, and school records and 33 educational histories <sup>3</sup>[, if <sup>2</sup>the<sup>2</sup> individual's next of kin or 34 authorized representative consents to 2the2 release 2of2 the 35 information or records ]<sup>3</sup>.
  - <sup>2</sup> The department shall also ensure that a copy of each such report of drug overdose death is promptly forwarded to the local drug overdose fatality review team assigned to the county in which the drug overdose death occurred. ]<sup>2</sup>
- e. Upon receipt of a report of drug overdose death <sup>2</sup>[which] 41 42 that<sup>2</sup> has been forwarded to a local drug overdose death fatality review team pursuant to subsection d. of this section, the team shall 43 review the reported case in accordance with the provisions of 44 subsection f. of this section<sup>1</sup>. 45
  - $^{1}$ [d]  $\underline{f}$ . Each local drug overdose fatality review team shall:
- (1) develop methods to help prevent drug overdoses; 47

- (2) explore methods to promote cooperation among multidisciplinary agencies in providing services to individuals with substance use disorders;
  - (3) develop an understanding of the causes of drug overdoses;
- (4) recommend possible changes to law and policy to prevent drug overdoses; and
  - (5) meet at least quarterly to review drug overdose <sup>2</sup>death<sup>2</sup> cases <sup>2</sup>[submitted] transmitted<sup>2</sup> to the <sup>1</sup>[commissioner] <sup>2</sup>[department<sup>1</sup>] team<sup>2</sup> pursuant to this section, as well as available criminal, educational, substance abuse, and mental health records of the deceased individuals. <sup>2</sup>Local drug overdose fatality review team meetings shall be closed to the public <sup>3</sup>, and information discussed at the meetings shall be deemed confidential <sup>3</sup>.<sup>2</sup>

"Drug overdose" means an acute condition including, but not limited to, <sup>3</sup>extreme<sup>3</sup> physical illness, coma, <sup>3</sup>[mania, hysteria,] decreased level of consciousness, respiratory depression, <sup>3</sup> or death resulting from the consumption or use of a controlled dangerous substance or another substance with which a controlled dangerous substance was combined and that a layperson would reasonably believe to require medical assistance.

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> 2. Names and individual identification data collected pursuant to the provisions of this act shall not be disclosed by the <sup>1</sup>[Commissioner] <u>Department</u> of Health or a local drug overdose fatality review team member unless required by law, and nothing in this act shall be construed to require disclosure of any private or confidential health information in violation of State or federal <sup>2</sup>Notwithstanding the foregoing, State and local privacy laws. government agencies are directed to share, upon request by <sup>3</sup>the Department of Law and Public Safety for integration into its integrated drug awareness dashboard, or by a local drug overdose fatality review team, and <sup>3</sup>[, in the case of confidential or personal identifying information, with the consent of the next of kin or authorized representative of the individual who is the subject of the information or record, 13 such information or records as may be necessary and appropriate for the local drug overdose fatality review team to conduct a review of reported drug overdose deaths pursuant to section 1 of this act <sup>3</sup>or for the Department of Law and Public Safety to integrate into its integrated drug awareness dashboard in order to protect the public health, safety, and welfare<sup>3</sup>.2
