SYNOPSIS

Prohibits public institutions of higher education from making certain payouts to departing employees that are not contractually obligated; requires Secretary of Higher Education to approve certain higher education employment contracts.

Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a 9 public institution of higher education shall not make any payments 10 to an employee or former employee for the purpose of sabbatical 11 leave or employment severance unless the institution is 12 contractually bound to pay that amount pursuant to the terms of the 13 employment contract between the institution and the employee. 14 In the event that a public institution of higher education b. 15 violates the provisions of this section, the State Treasurer shall debit 16 from the institution's State operating aid an amount equal to the 17 difference between any contractually-obligated amount and the 18 amount actually paid by the institution to the employee or former 19 employee. 20 21 2. Any multi-year contract between a public institution of higher 22 education and an employee for a salary amount of more than 23 \$100,000 per year shall, prior to the execution of the contract, be 24 reviewed and approved by the Secretary of Higher Education. The 25 secretary shall adopt standards and criteria for the review and 26 approval process. 27 3. This act shall take effect immediately. 28 29 30 31 **STATEMENT** 32 33 This bill prohibits a public institution of higher education from 34 making any payments to an employee or former employee for the 35 purpose of sabbatical leave or employment severance unless the 36 institution is contractually bound to pay that amount pursuant to the 37 terms of the employment contract between the institution and the 38 employee. Under the bill, if a public institution of higher education 39 violates this prohibition, the State Treasurer will debit from the 40 institution's State operating aid an amount equal to the difference 41 between any contractually-obligated amount and the amount 42 actually paid by the institution to the employee or former employee. 43 In addition, the bill requires the Secretary of Higher Education to 44 review and approve any multi-year contract between a public 45 institution of higher education and an employee for a salary amount of more than \$100,000 per year, prior to the execution of that 46 47 contract. The secretary will adopt standards and criteria for the 48 review and approval process.
